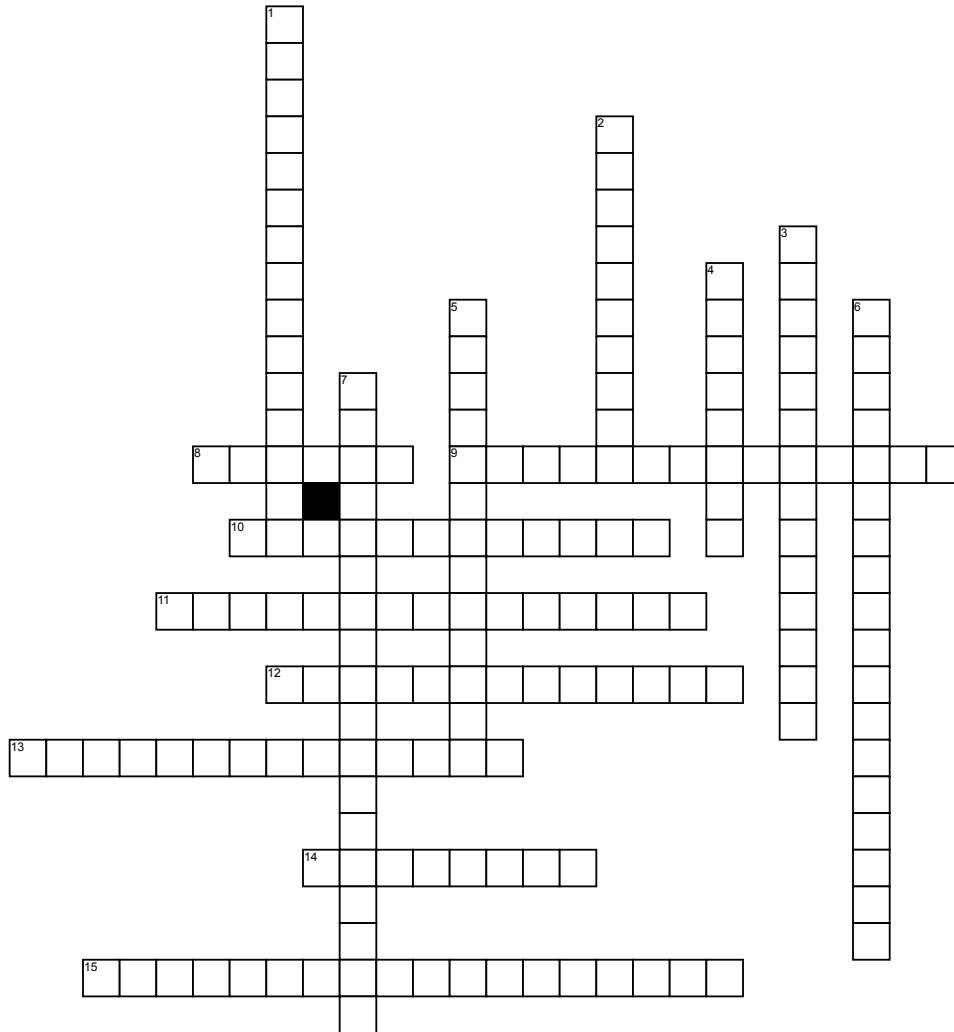

- 1. The transatlantic system of trade in which goods and people, including slaves, were exchanged between Africa, England, Europe, and the West Indies, and the colonies in North America

- 3. A 1739 uprising of slaves in South Carolina, leading to the tightening of already harsh slave laws

- 4. A trade law enacted by parliament in 1764 in an attempt to reduce smuggling in the British colonies in North America
- 5. An 18th century intellectual movement that emphasized the use of reason and the scientific method as means of obtaining knowledge
- 6. The transfer of the British monarchy from James II to William and Mary in 1688-1689
- 7. A conflict in North America, lasting from 1754 to 1763, that was part of a worldwide struggle between France and Britain and that ended with the defeat of France and the transfer of French Canada to Britain
