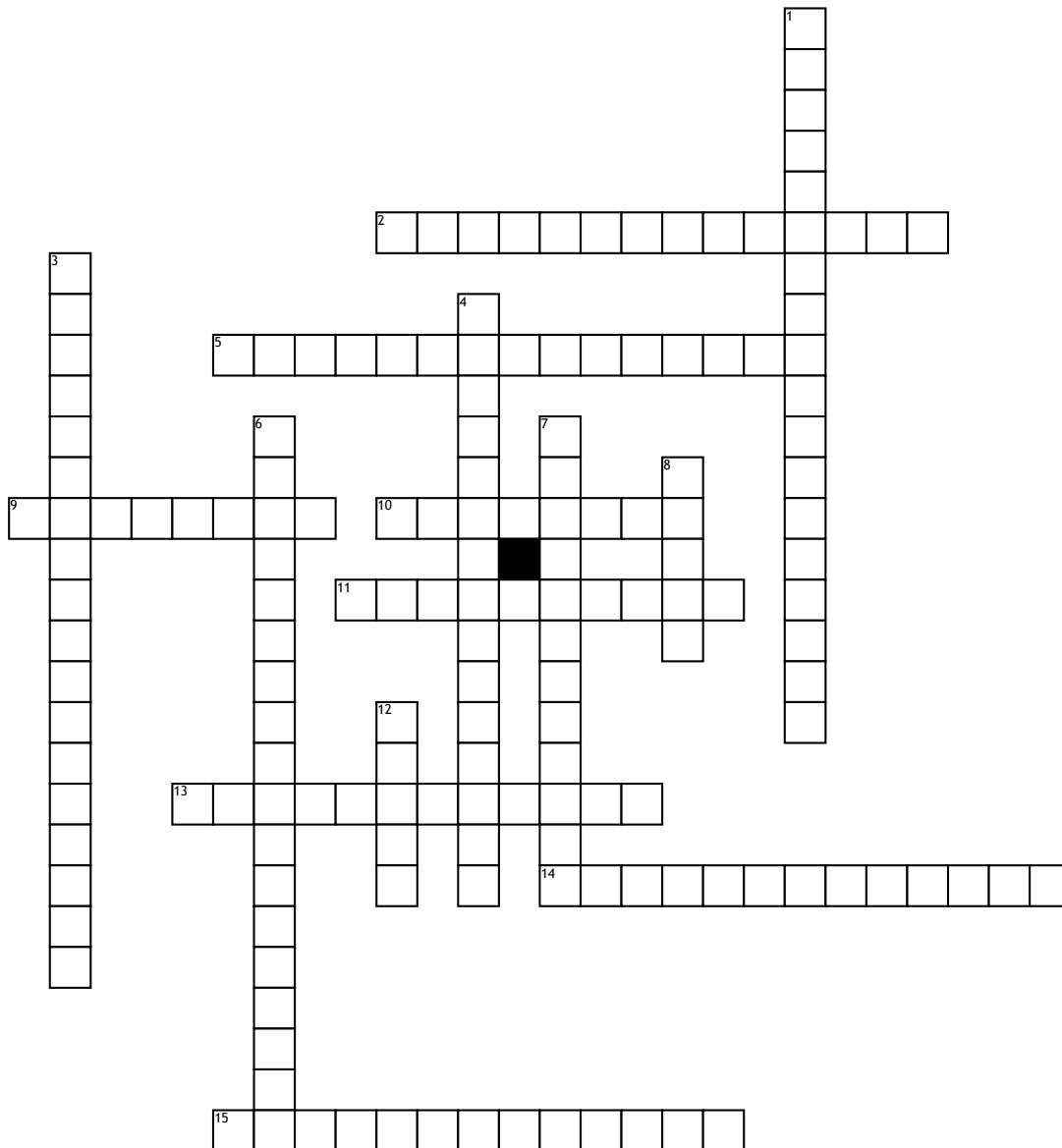

1. An order in which Britain prohibited its America colonist from setting West of the Appalachian mountains

4. The transatlantic system of trade in which goods and people including slaves were exchanged between Africa, England, Europe, the West Indies, and the colonies in North America.

7. An economic system in which nations seek to increase their wealth and power by obtaining large amounts of gold and silver and by establishing a favorable balance of trade
