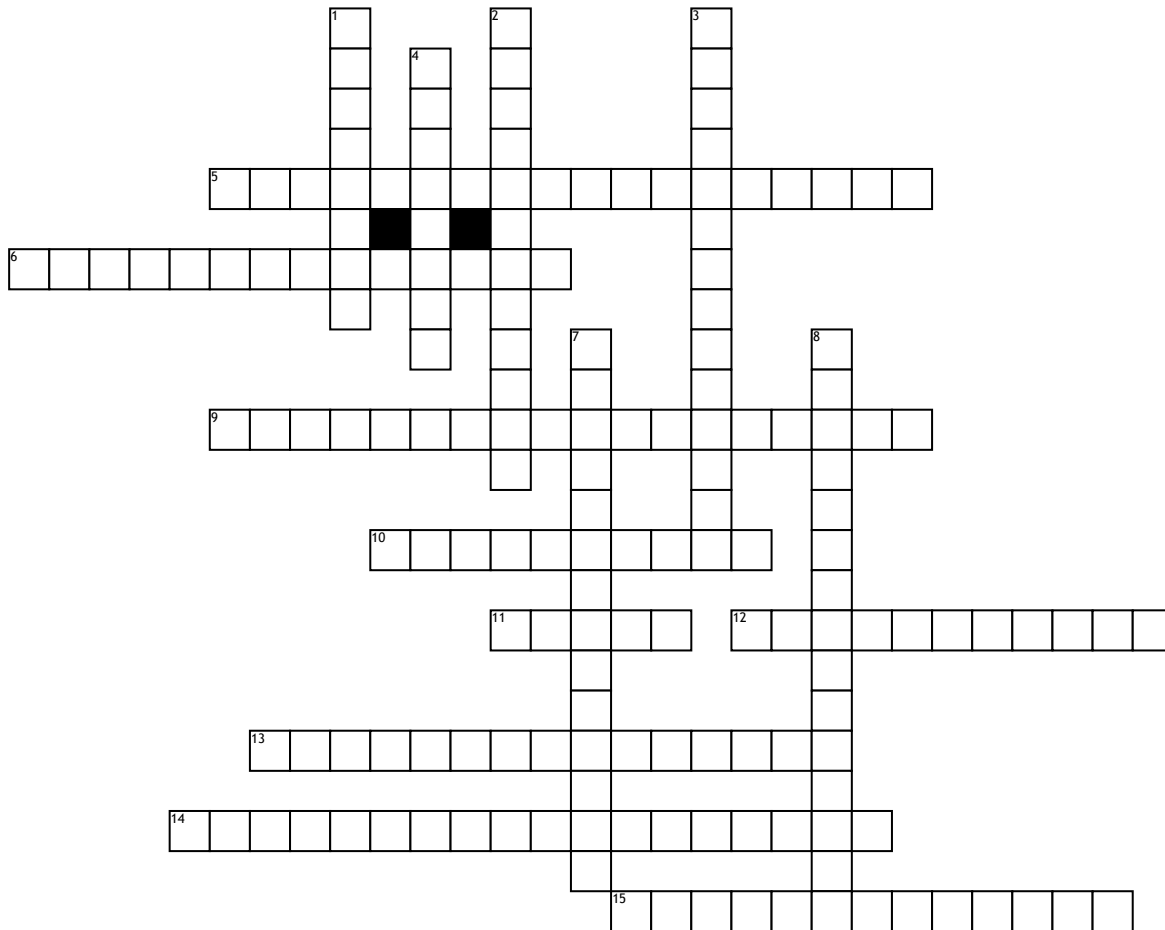

2. Economic system where nations seek to increase their wealth and power by obtaining a favorable balance of trade.

3. 1739 uprising of slaves in South Carolina, leading to the tightening of already harsh slave laws.

4. Trade law enacted by Parliament in 1764 in an attempt to reduce smuggling in the British colonies in North America.

7. Revival of religious feelings in the American colonies during the 1730s and 1750s.

8. Transatlantic system of trade where goods and people, including slaves, were exchanged between Africa, Europe, England, West Indies, and North Americas.
