
10. powers not expressed in the constitution, but they are reasonably suggested by the expressed powers.

1. agreements among themselves and with foreign states.

2. clause from the constitution that states that various states must recognize legislative acts, public records, and judicial decisions of the other states within the United States.

3. the legal process by which a fugitive from justice in one state can be returned to that state.



4. grants made for much more broadly defined purposes than are categorical grants.

5. grants made to states, localities, and sometimes private agencies that apply for the grant.

8. an act directing the people of the territory to frame a proposed state constitution.

9. a system of government in which a written constitution divides the powers of government on a territorial basis, between a central government and several regional governments, usually called states or provinces.
