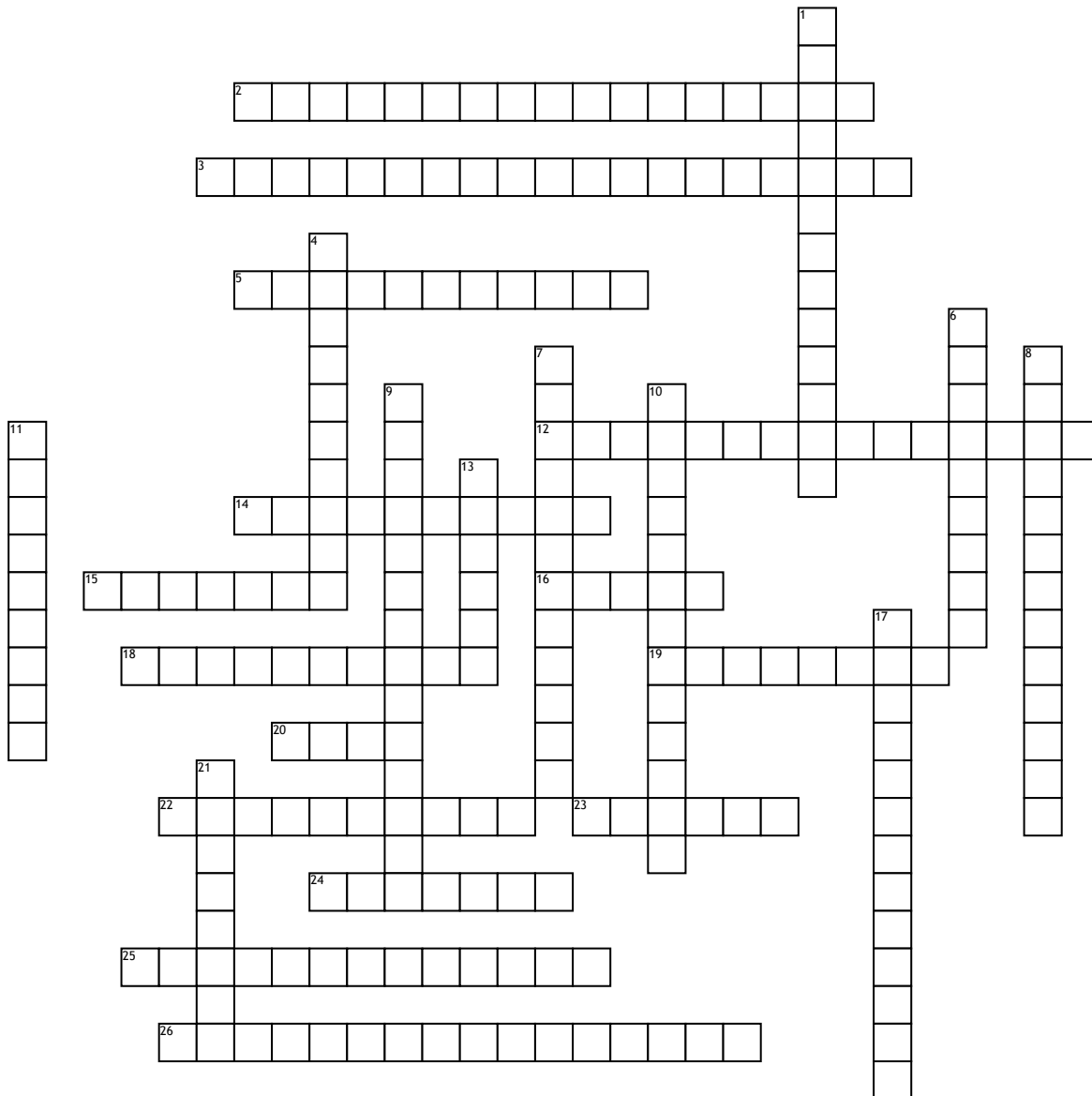

5. French envoy to the United States appointed by the Girondins during the French Revolution.
12. American statesman, diplomat, lawyer, architect, philosopher, and Founding Father who served as the third president of the United States from 1801 to 1809.
14. a person who invests in stocks, property, or other ventures in the hope of making a profit.
15. advisory body and its role is to advise the President on any subject that he may require.
16. belonging to a foreign country or nation.
18. Louisiana city on the Mississippi River, near the Gulf of Mexico.
