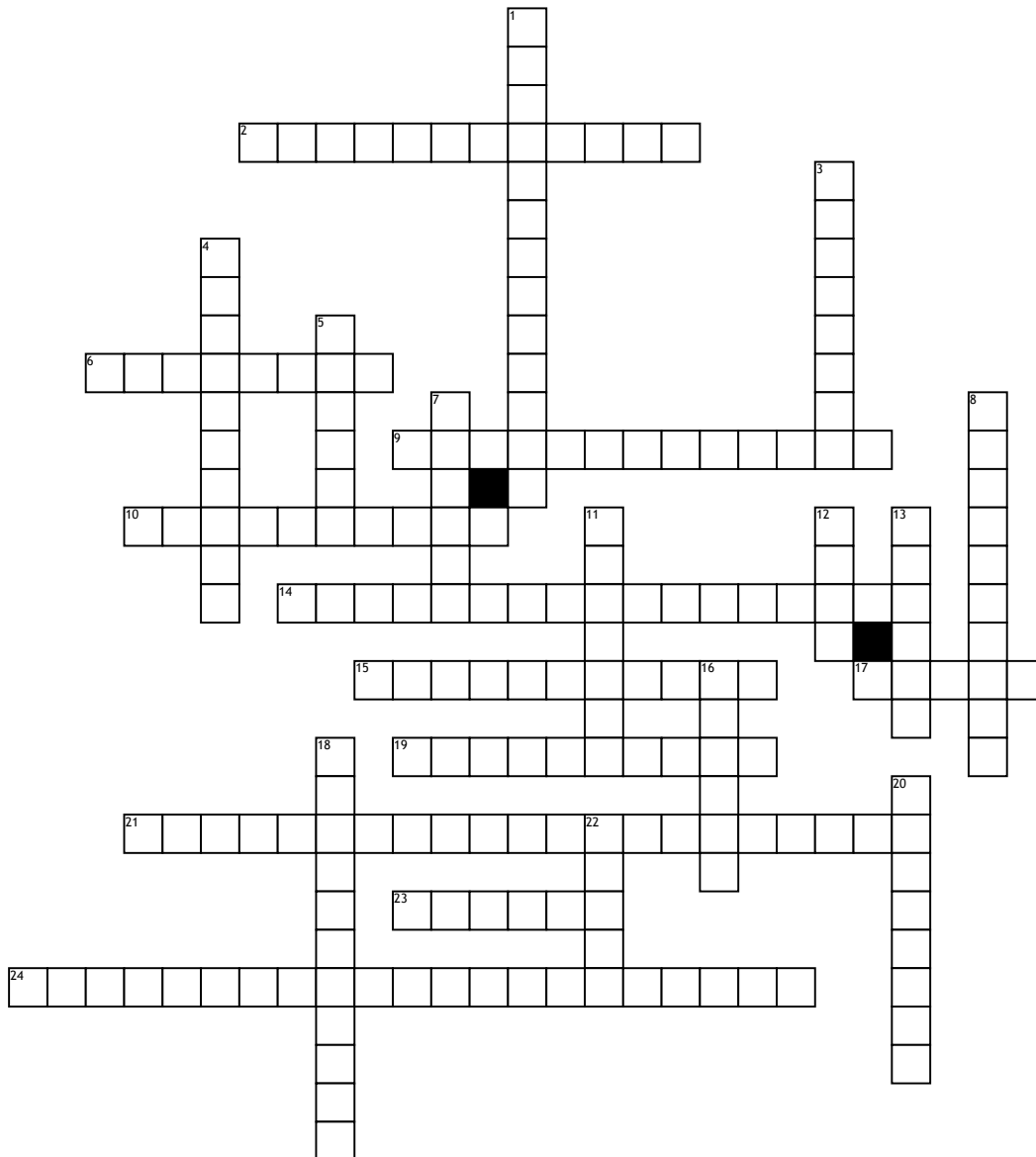

 10. One of three stages of pregnancy, each with unique emotional and physical characteristics

 15. The fluid filled sac that encloses the embryo and fetus

1. A technique that enables doctors to check for fetal abnormalities that might cause birth defects

3. A condition in which a substance present in the blood can cause problems with the pregnancy

4. The moment when the male and female reproductive cells unite; also called fertilization

5. The pear shaped organ where the embryo and fetus develops; also called the womb

7. The ball of rapidly multiplying cells that develops during the second stage of prenatal development, which lasts from the end of the second week of pregnancy through the eighth week

8. High frequency sound waves that are bounced off the developing fetus to produce video, image or sonogram
