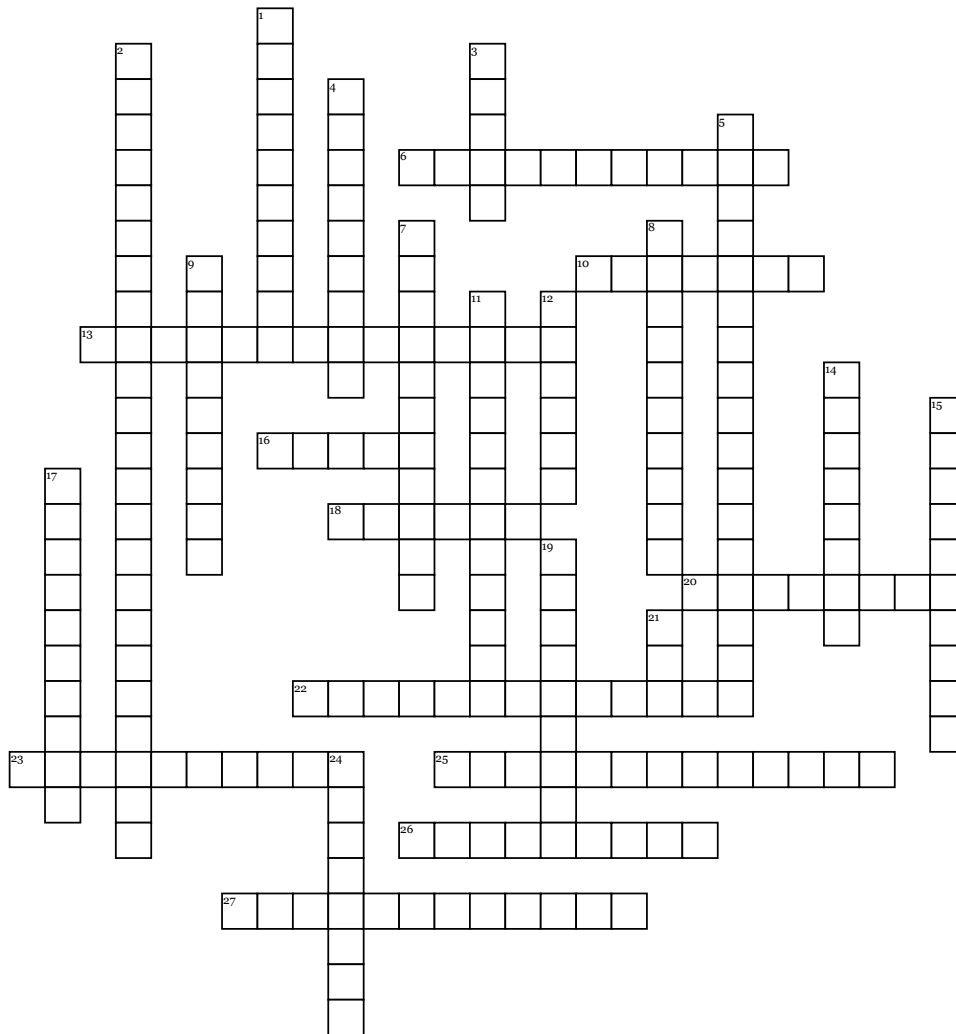

- 17.** a therapeutic device to help maintain standing position

- 19.** mobility devices, prostheses, and prescribed alterations of standard furnishings to meet the needs of exceptional children ADAPTIVE

- 21.** an acronym for the framework that guides the development of curricula that are flexible and supportive of all students

- 24.** caused by a disturbance of the electrical activity of the brain
