Name for the area that included Australia, New Guinea and K. pic Tasmania 12. Area, which included the islands of the Philippines and eastern L. Tasmania Indonesia (Sulawesi, the Moluccas, and the Lesser Sundas), that never had a land bridge to Asia or Greater Australia, in which migration was done via the sea
