

5. a speech delivered by American civil rights activist Martin Luther King Jr. during the March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom on August 28, 1963 in Washington, D.C., he calls for an end to racism in the United States and called for civil and economic rights
6. in 1955, a black seamstress from Montgomery, Alabama, refused to give up her seat on a Montgomery city bus to a white person, as she was legally required to do and her actions sparked the Montgomery Bus Boycott
8. American feminist organization founded in 1966 that fights for equality for women
9. any school that receives any federal money must provide fair and equal treatment of the sexes in all areas
10. a landmark United States supreme court case in which the court declared state laws segregating schools unconstitutional

1. the refusal to comply with certain laws as a peaceful form of protest
2. a group of nine African American students enrolled in Little Rock High School in 1957 to challenge Brown v. the Board to see if integrated to see if an integrated school would be upheld, after several weeks the National Guard ensured their safety and entrance to the school
3. a four part piece of American legislation that ensures students with a disability are provided with free appropriate public education that is tailored to their individual needs
7. Legislation passed in 1990 that prohibits discrimination against people with disabilities. Under this Act, discrimination against a disabled person is illegal in employment, transportation, public accommodations, communications and government activities
