

- **4.** occupying a place as a form of protest, the sit-in movement began at a Woolsworth lunch counter in Grensborrow, NC
- **5.** a speech delivered by American civil rights activist Martin Luther King Jr. during the March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom on August 28, 1963 in Washington, D.C., he calls for an end to racism in the United States and called for civil and economic rights
- **6.** in 1955, a black seamstress from Montgomery, Alabama, refused to give up her seat on a Montgomery city bus to a white person, as she was legally required to do and her actions sparked the Montgomery Bus Boycott
- **8.** American feminist organization founded in 1966 that fights for equality for women
- **9.** any school that recieves any fedral money must provide fair and equal treatment of the sexes in all areas
- 10. a landmark United States supreme court case in wich the court declared stated laws seregating schools unconstitutional

- 2. a group of nine african american students enroled in little rock high school in 1957 to challenge Brown v. the Board to see if integratied to see if an intigrated school would be upheld, afted several weeks the national guard ensured their saftey and entrance to the school
- 3. a four part peice of American legislation that ensures students with a disability are provided with free appropriate public education that is taylored to their individual needs
 7. Legislation passed in 1990 that prohibits discrimination against people with disabilities. Under this Act, discrimination against a disabled person is illegal in employment, transportation, public accommodations, communications and government activities
