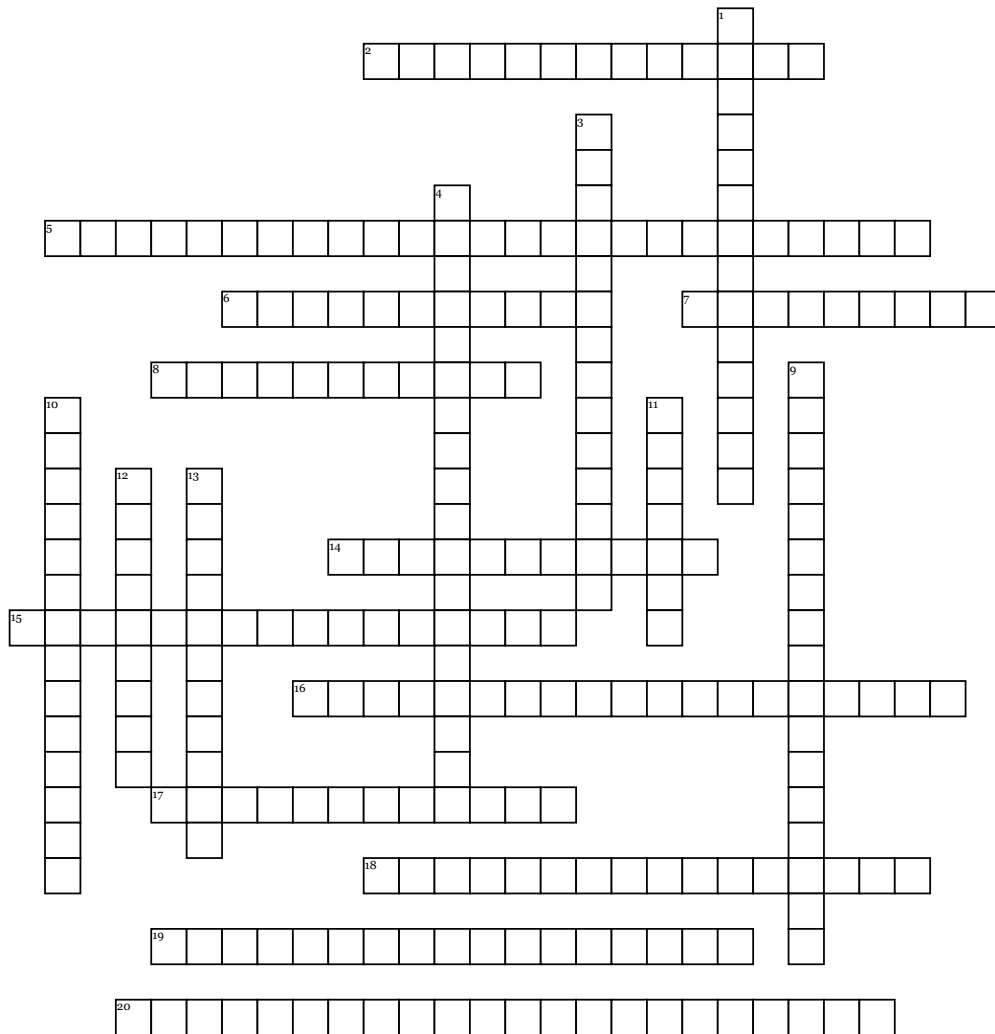

- 2.** Controversial flag that flew over GA from 1956-2001. The flag was controversial due to the flag's prominent Confederate Battle emblem.
- 5.** A Civil rights Organization by college students that urged non-violent protest to gain integration; the group became more militant.
- 6.** As mayor of Atlanta he continued Hartfield development policies MARTA and 1 of the best known for bringing the Braves, Hawks, and the NFL Atlanta Falcons.
- 7.** Who was the mayor of Atlanta who was instrumental in the development of the city, bringing major league sports teams to Atlanta, and a key figure in the civil rights movement.
- 8.** Governor at the end of WWII that made modernized changes to GA
- 14.** important civil rights leader who served as U.S. ambassador to the United Nations and Mayor of Atlanta; was also instrumental in bringing the 1996 Olympic Games to Atlanta.

- 15.** Who is the investigation by lawyer John Sibley to determine what should be done about integration in the state.
- 16.** important civil rights leader and winner of the Nobel Peace Prize.
- 17.** one of the last openly segregationist politicians in Georgia (Governor).
- 18.** the Olympic Games are an international athletic event that occurs every four years; the 1996 Olympic Games were awarded to Atlanta and the state of Georgia; Georgia has benefited economically due to the games
- 19.** the famous jobs and civil rights march led by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.; the famous "I Have a Dream" speech was given at the march.
- 20.** Supreme Court cases that struck down the policy of separate but equal and mandated the desegregation of public schools.

- 1.** an organized civil rights protest led by the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee, whose primary objective was to desegregate the city of Albany, Georgia, and the surrounding community.

- 3.** first African-American or Black mayor of a major southern city (Atlanta).
- 4.** Who was Atlanta's longest serving mayor who was instrumental in bringing aviation to the city and worked with civil rights leaders during the civil rights movement.
- 9.** This is also called the three Governors Controversy. Due to the death of the 1946 governor's race winner Eugene Talmadge and recent changes to the GA state constitution.
- 10.** federal legislation that forbade discrimination on the basis of race and sex in hiring, firing, and promotion.
- 11.** Became a major air and truck hub city.
- 12.** leader in the Civil Rights movement leader of the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee; U.S. Representative
- 13.** only United States President from Georgia; also a Georgia state senator and governor, and winner of the Nobel Peace Prize.
