

Underground Railroad

- 1. September 1862 battle in Maryland that ended Lee's first invasion of the North; bloodiest single day of fighting during the war
- **2.** Political party formed in 1848 to oppose the extension of slavery into U.S. territories
- **4.** Union fort in the harbor of Charleston, South Carolina where the first shots of the Civil War were fired in April 1861
- **5.** Commander of the Confederate Army
- 7. Fifteenth POTUS (1857-1861), Democratic

- 8. Sixteenth POTUS (1861-1865), Republican Party
- **9.** Term used to describe the 1854-1856 violence between pro-slavery and anti-slavery supporters in Kansas
- 10. "The Little Giant"; U.S. senator from Illinois who worked to pass the Compromise of 1850
- 11. Union strategy to defeat the Confederacy
- **13.** The belief that native-born white Americans are superior to foreign-born immigrants
- 14. Confederate ironclad ship
- **18.** Mexican-American War hero and Republican Party candidate in the 1856 presidential election
- **22.** Slave who sued for his freedom in the Supreme Court in 1857
