
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Civil War Crossword Puzzle

- 4. the first real battle of the civil war

- 15. Confederate forces suprised union troops & drove them across the Tennesee river; Union got backup and won the battle but it was one of the most bloody battles in the Civil War
- **16.** Turning point of war, the Union victory ends with Pickett's charge. 50,000 people died, and the South lost its chance to invade the North.
- **18.** the first major battle in the American Civil War to take place on Northern soil. It was the bloodiest single-day battle in American history, with almost 23,000 casualties. After this "win" for the North, Lincoln announced the Emancipation Proclamation

- **20.** Issued by Abraham Lincoln on Septemeber 22, 1862, it declared that all slaves in the rebellious Confederate states would be free.
