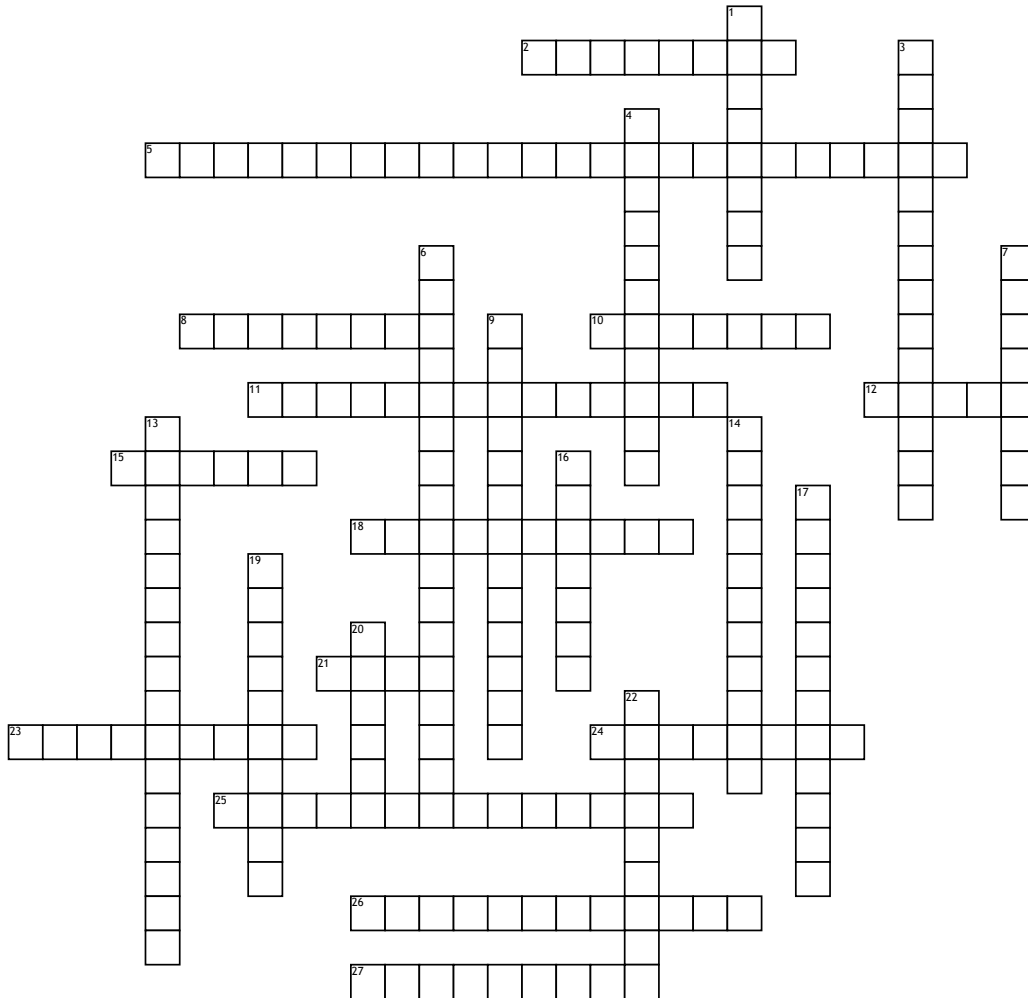


Civil War Terms

- 2. Hard crackers served to both sides in the civil war normally made from flour and water then sometime salt.
- 5. An executive order from President Abraham Lincoln stating that slaves in the Confederate states were to be set free.
- 8. An attempt to stop people and supplies from going in or out of a port.
- 10. Branch of Military mounted on horseback
- 11. The rebuilding of war torn southern states so they could be readmitted into the Union after the Civil War
- 12. The side of an army or military unit
- 15. A long gun with a smooth bore that soldiers shot from the shoulder.
- 18. Before war, often used to describe the United States before the Civil War
- 21. A cap worn by Civil War soldiers.
- 23. Large caliber firearms like cannons and mortars
- 24. A warship that is fully covered and protected by iron cladding

- 25. The fighting during the Civil War that took place west of the Appalachian Mountains. It eventually included the fighting in Georgia and the Carolina as well
- 26. These states were slave states that did not leave the Union, but largely supported the cause of the Confederates. They included Missouri, Kentucky, Maryland, and Delaware.
- 27. A canvas bag that many Civil War soldiers used to carry their food.

- 1. A nickname for southern whites who supported the Republican Party.
- 3. A boundary or border that split the free states from the slave states. It went between Pennsylvania to the north and Virginia, Maryland, and Delaware to the south.
- 4. A commutation was when a person could pay a fee rather than be drafted into the army. This angered poorer people who could not pay the fee and had no choice but to fight.
- 6. A decision made by the Supreme Court that said Congress could not outlaw slavery and that people of African descent were not necessarily U.S. citizens.

- 7. An attempt to stop people and supplies from going in or out of a port.
- 9. Northerners who moved to the South after the Civil War
- 13. A law passed by Congress in 1850 that said escaped slaves in free states had to be returned to their owners.
- 14. Another name for the Confederate States of America or the South. The Confederacy was a group of states that left the United States to form their own country.
- 16. An army of citizens used during emergencies.
- 17. Putting the local interests and customs ahead of the entire country.
- 19. A nickname for northerners who were against the Civil War.
- 20. When the southern states chose to leave the United States and to no longer be a part of the country.
- 22. A nickname for United States paper money that was first used in 1862. It got its name from the green ink used in printing.
