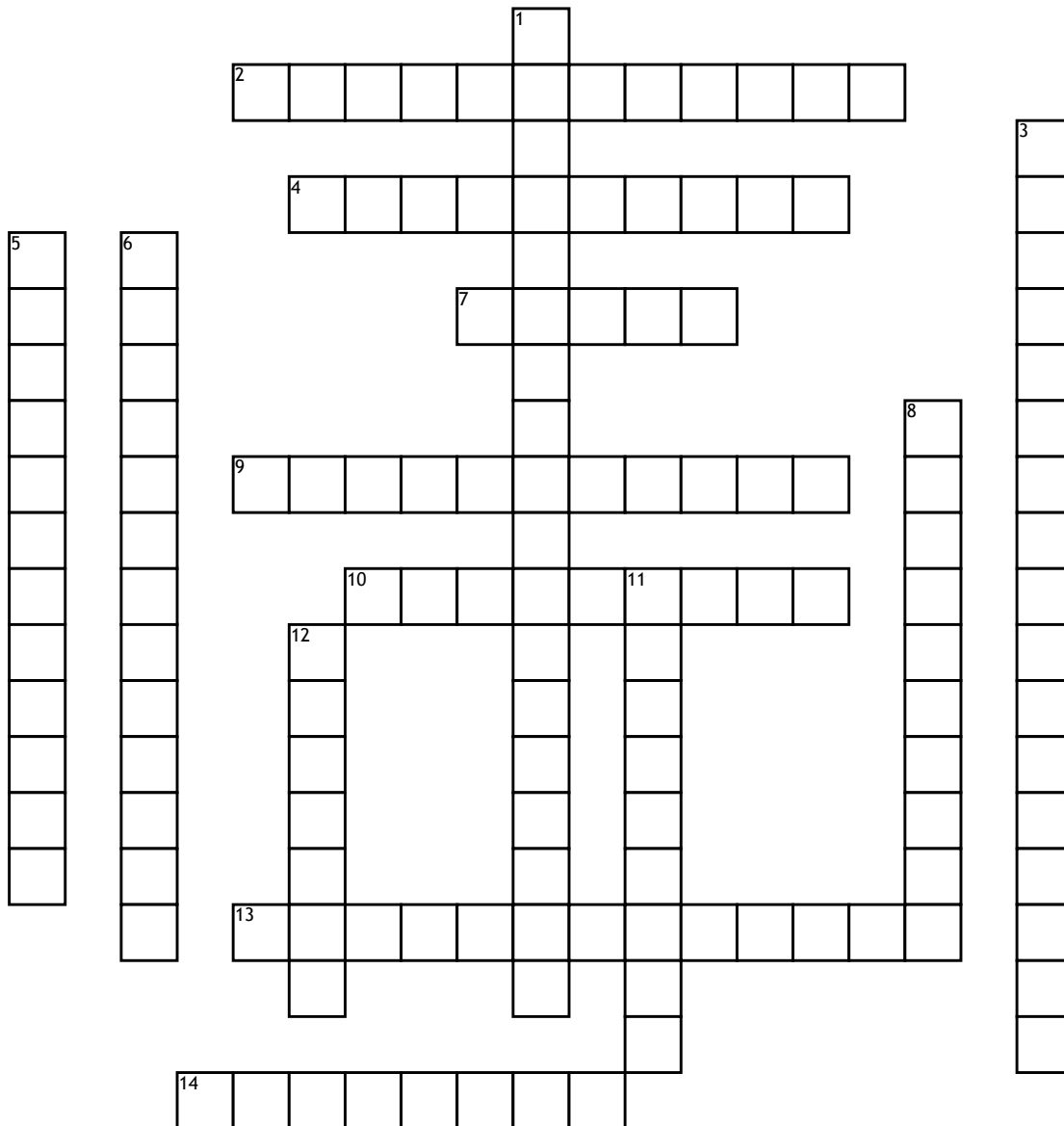

1. A doctrine in political theory that government is created by and subject to the will of the people.

3. A clause exempting certain classes of people or things from the requirements of a piece of legislation affecting their previous rights, privileges, or practices.

5. An examination to determine whether a person meets the literacy requirement for voting, serving in the armed forces, often used to prevent illiterate people from engaging in politics and schools.

6. The amendment in the US constitution that formally abolished slavery.

8. Laws that were designed to restrict and limit the freedom of freed African Americans to ensure their availability as a cheap labor force.

11. A white southerner who collaborated with the northern Republicans during the reconstruction, often for personal profit.

12. A tax levied on every adult, without reference to income or resources, often there to restrict lower income voters.
