

- **3.** each of the four divisions of the year (spring, summer, autumn, and winter)
- **5.** height above a given level, especially sea level
- an area of high or mountainous land
 prevailing weather conditions of a
- **10.** prevailing weather conditions of a region
- 12. climate that does not meet the criteria to be classified as a polar climate, and in which precipitation is too low to sustain any vegetation at all
- **13.** region of the world where there is little precipitation and the air is very dry
- **15.** Earth's temperate zones between the tropics and the Arctic and Antarctic polar regions

- **16.** a large naturally occurring community of flora and fauna occupying a major habitat
