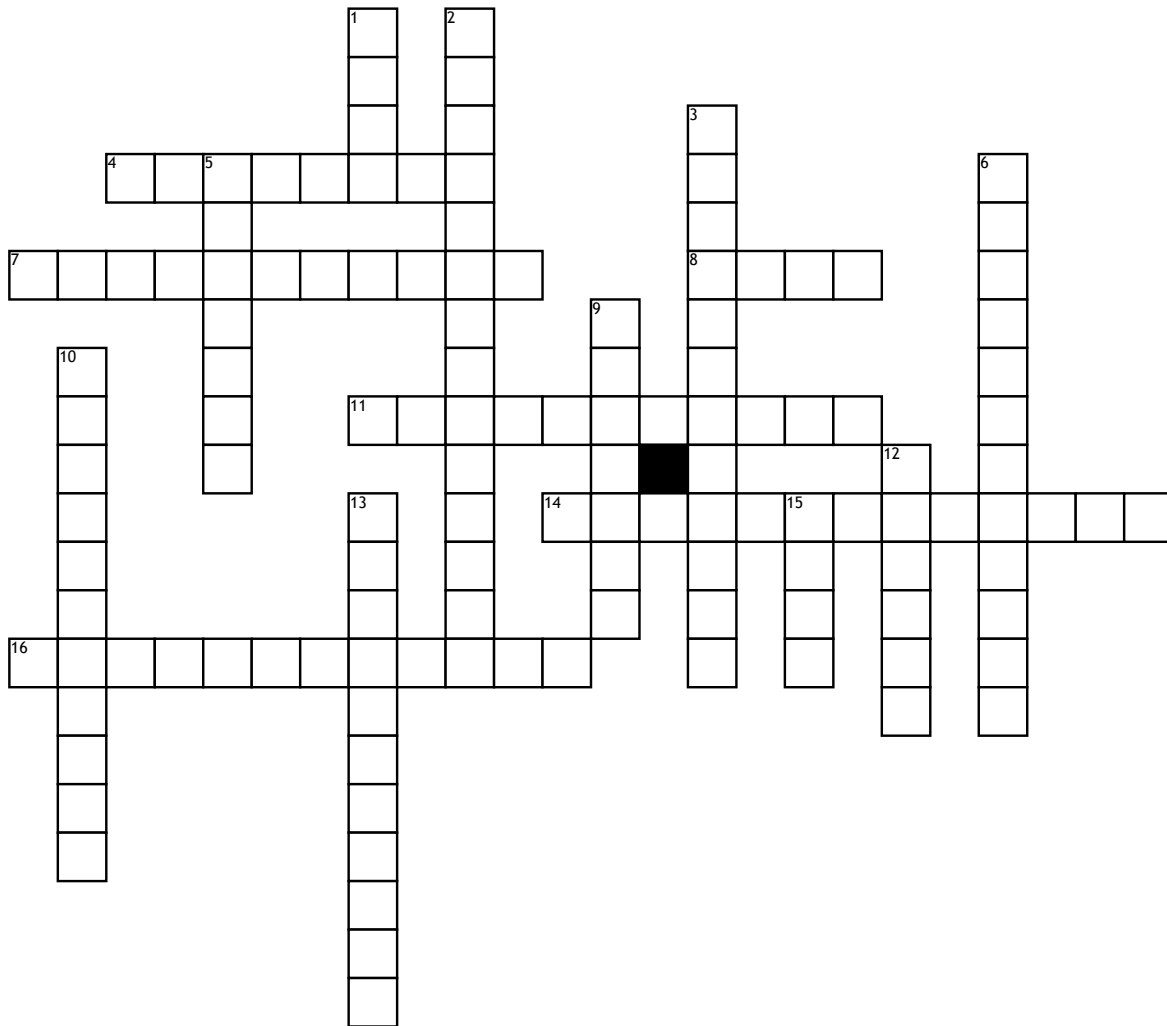

- 1. an organization formed in Washington, D.C. (1949), comprising the 12 nations of the Atlantic Pact together with Greece, Turkey, and the Federal Republic of Germany
- 2. the policy of President Truman, as advocated in his address to Congress on March 12, 1947, to provide military and economic aid to Greece and Turkey and, by extension
- 3. the line of latitude 38 degrees North (38° N), in East Asia, which roughly marks the border between North Korea and South Korea

- 5. a person who rejects or avoid conventional behavior, dress, etc.
- 6. european recovery program
- 9. the southern and southwestern region of the U.S.
- 10. a modern movement for the protection of the consumer against useless, inferior, or dangerous products, misleading advertising, unfair pricing, etc.
