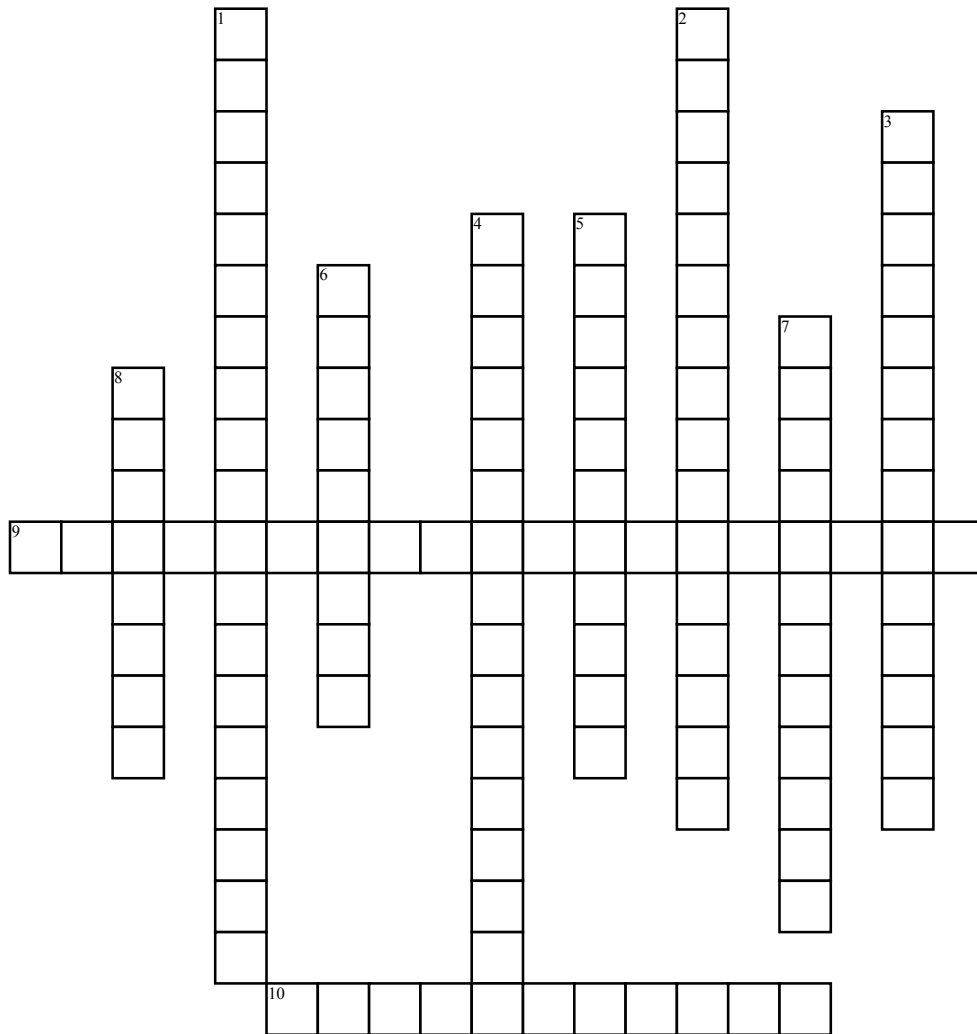

1. Awarded when a student completes his/her four-year college/university coursework and requirements.

2. Unlike subsidized loans, the government does not supplement interest accrued during college.

3. If an applicant qualifies based on FAFSA information, the U.S. government pays for any interest accrued during college and gives a loan grace period after college graduation.

4. Primarily offer degrees in undergraduate and graduate programs that focus on fine and performing arts, business, or engineering.

5. This includes an extra point on a 4.0-point scale for honors and advanced placement classes.

6. Students can get these jobs on campus and the U.S. federal government helps pay their work study salary.

7. Includes information about the student's class rank, GPA, academic courses, attendance rate and any discipline incidents.
