

9. some colleges/universities offer "early action" deadlines (usually in November (, by which student submit their full application before the regular deadline (usually in December or January) and receive their acceptance statues earlier than the regular deadline.

10. Most colleges/universities require essays as part of the application. Essay promts are the question or statement to be addressed within the essay content/

1. is a more detailed financial aid application that the FAFSA and is required by some, but not all,colleges/universities.

2. A measure of how student's GPA compares to other students in the same graduating class.

3. Many colleges/university use the "common application" system, a basic college application that can be used for multiple schools.

4. The terms "college " and "university can both representative four-year post-secondary school.

5. Early decision is similar to early action, but if the student is accepted to the college/university, it is a binding agreement and the student must attend that school.
