
Colors and Markings

1. The color comes from a Dun overlay on a black.
3. a yellowish gray with dark points
5. The gene dilutes the base colors chestnut, bay and black. When it dilutes palomino or buckskin, it gets even lighter.
9 is used to describe a spotted horse of any breed.
13. A has a chestnut base color with white hairs mixed in and red or dark red/brown points. They can have red or blonde mane and tail.
15. The coat is made up of white hairs and hairs with color in them, can be light or dark.
16. has white spots that never cross over the top of the back, neck or rump.
17. A is a dark base color with white hairs mixed in; has dark points and black undertones.

19. ______coloring is gray with distinct white marks splattered throughout the coat. When a dapple gray has black points, it can be called a blue roan as well. (two words)

20. lighter colored round spots on the coat.

21. has a black coat and black points, most have white skin.
