

- **4.** Use good eye contact. Your gaze shows that you're listening and not distracted.
- **6.** Face squarely; by doing this it shows you are involved.
- **7.** Primarily associated with two dimensional images, it includes: alphanumeric, art, signs, and electronic resources.

- **10.** Includes gestures, facial expressions, and body positions (known collectively as "body language"), as well as unspoken understandings and presuppositions

- 1. Encompasses both how you deliver messages and how you receive them. Communication is a soft skill
- 2. Refers to the process of conveying a message through the written symbols. In other words, any message exchanged between two or more persons that make use of written words
- **3.** Is the use of messages to generate meaning, both within and across a myriad of cultures, contexts, channels, and media
- **5.** It's important to stay calm and avoid fidgeting when a person is talking to show you are focused.
