

## <u>Across</u>

**5.** process of influencing behavior by means of unpleasant stimuli

7. learned reactions that follow one another in sequence, each reaction producing the signal for the next

**8.** stimulus or event that follows a response and increases the likelihood that the response will be repeated

**9.** learning in which a certain action is reinforced or punished, resulting in corresponding increases or decreases in occurrence

**10.** increasing the strength of a given response by removing or preventing a painful stimulus when the response occurs

## <u>Down</u>

**1.** training of an organism to respond so as to prevent the occurrence of unpleasant stimulus

**2.** stimulus such as money that becomes rewarding through its link with a primary reinforcer

**3.** training of an organism to remove or terminate an unpleasant stimulus

**4.** stimulus that satisfies a biological need such as food or water

**6.** technique in which the desired behavior is "molded" by first rewarding any act similar to that behavior and then requiring ever-closer approximations to the desired behavior before giving the reward
