
Conflict Management

- **16.** Developed by Lewin and others; the theory suggests there are types of forces that drive conflict and forces that restrain conflict.
- **17.** A struggle among a small number of interdependent people arising from perceived interference with goal achievement.
- **18.** The concept that people consistently make sense of the world by assigning meaning and motives to others' behaviors.
- 19. A relational theory suggesting individuals make choices about relationships by evaluating the personal rewards, costs, and expected profits / benefits involved in maintaining that relationship.

20. Assigning motive to factors external to the individual, such as the environment or outside circumstances

- 10. In attribution theory, where one ascribes motivations for personal behavior to a personal character trait when it is most flattering and to situation constraints to diminish personal responsibility.
- 11. Fred's psychological theory that behavior is motivated by both the conscious and subconscious mind where the id, ego, and superego are all vying for control
- 12. A theory that highlights the complex nature of life and holds that the interdependency of all the relationships among individuals in a system, as well as the surrounding environment, must be considered to understand the whole.
- **13.** Conflicts caused by misinterpretations and misinformation.
- 14. Tentative explanations for observed behaviors.
