

- **3.** Social comparison experiment where participants were asked to say which line is standard, however, confederates present will give wrong answer
- **6.** Adjusting one's behavior because of an explicit request
- **9.** Loss of self awareness and self restraint
- **11.** The study where a person of given authority administers shocks to others, 60-70 gave max voltage

- **12.** The improved performance of tasks in the presence of others
- **13.** Conformity based on a person's desire to fulfill others' expectations, often to gain acceptance
- **14.** Acting according to group norms of customs

- **1.** Shows the power that situations can have in changing how we feel, think and behave
- **2.** Apparent movement of a stationary point of light in the dark, an optical illusion

- **4.** Rules for acceptance and expected behaviors
- **5.** Change in attitude or behavior brought about by social pressure to comply with people perceived to be authorities
- **7.** Conforming to the group in order to gain acceptance
- **8.** Unconsciously mimicking emotions, tones, expressions, and postures of others
