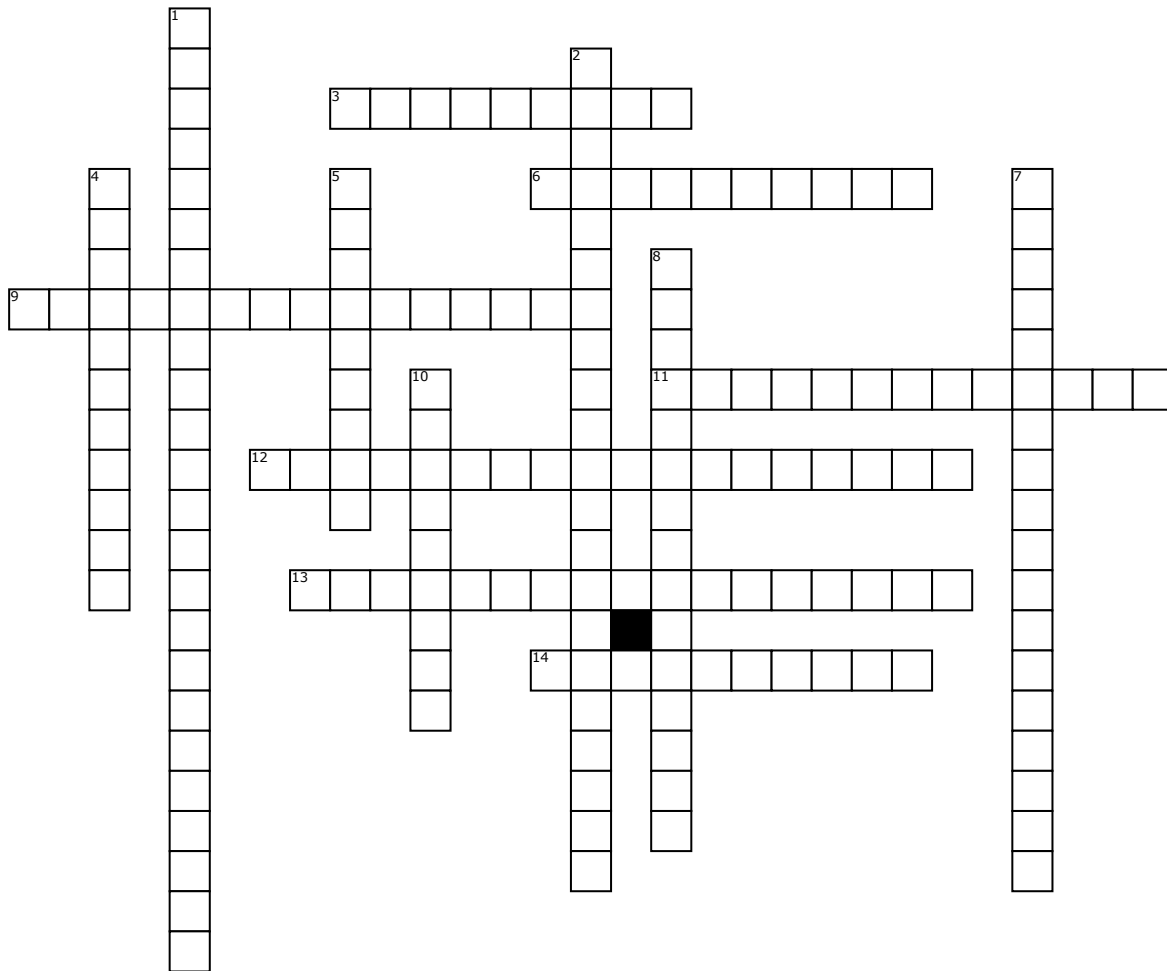

- 6.** Adjusting one's behavior because of an explicit request
- 9.** Loss of self awareness and self restraint
- 11.** The study where a person of given authority administers shocks to others, 60-70 gave max voltage

- 12.** The improved performance of tasks in the presence of others
- 13.** Conformity based on a person's desire to fulfill others' expectations, often to gain acceptance
- 14.** Acting according to group norms of customs

- 1.** Shows the power that situations can have in changing how we feel, think and behave
- 2.** Apparent movement of a stationary point of light in the dark, an optical illusion

- 7.** Conforming to the group in order to gain acceptance
