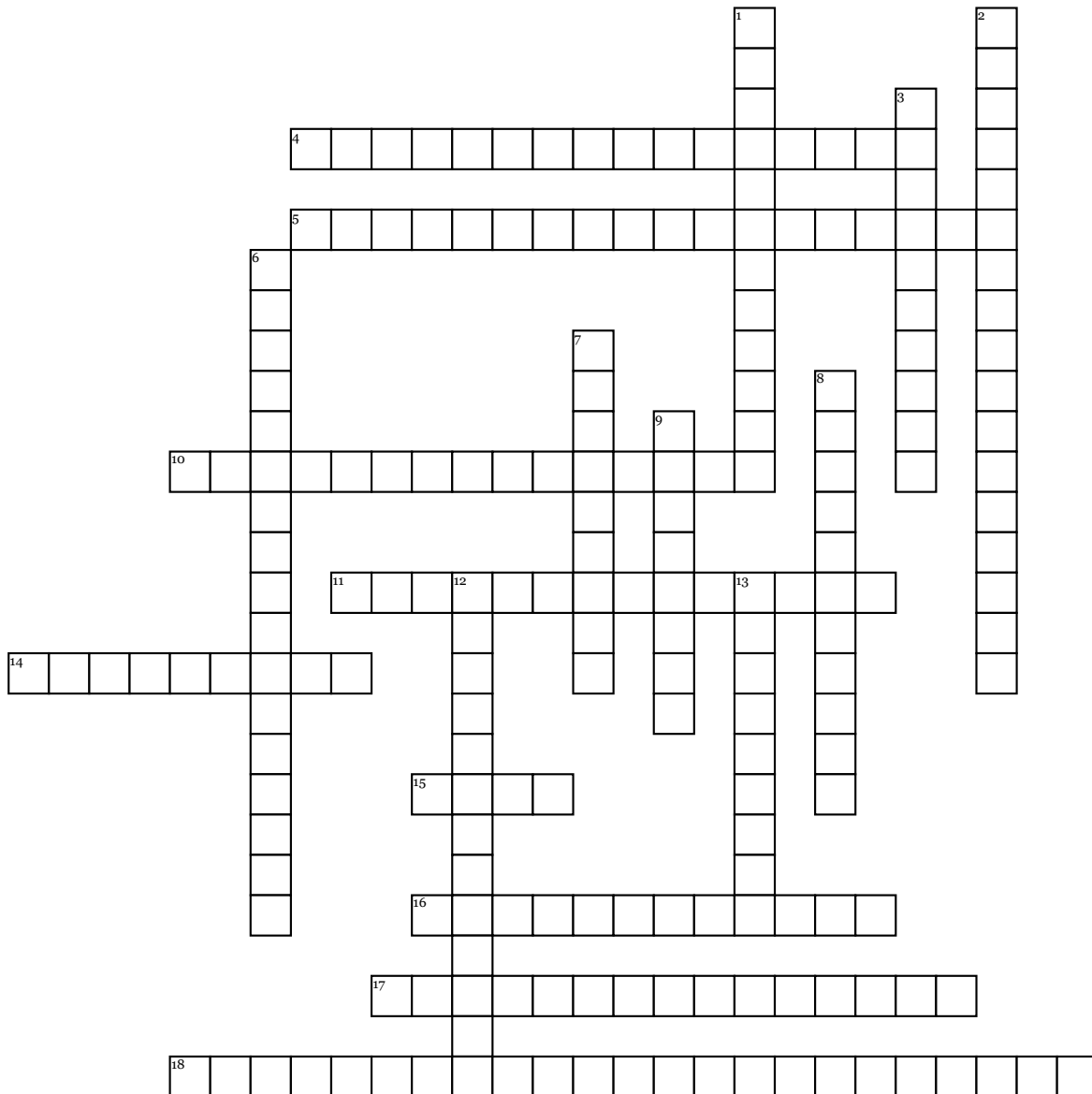


Constitution Crossword Puzzle
