

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Corsages and Boutonnieres

- **2.** color scheme which uses different hues and shades of one color
- **5.** used to hide the mechanics in a flower arrangement; commonly stems with lots of leaves and green materials; also referred to as greenery
- **6.** turned back portion of a jacket or coat which lays flat and is a continuance of the collar
- **8.** supplies, methods and materials which designers use to place and hold flowers and foliage in an arrangement
- 12. smaller stem which attaches a leaf to the main stem
- **16.** leaves or buds growing on the side of the main stem
- **18.** clusters of flowers used to fill spaces between larger flowers creating depth
- **19.** small undeveloped shoot, leaf or flower located at the tip of a stem
- **20.** condition of a plant cell when it has absorbed the maximum amount of water

- **21.** corsage wiring technique in which a wire is inserted through the calyx and bent downward along the stem
- ${\bf 23.}\ {\bf straight}$ or hook bladed knife used to cut floral stems
- **24.** quick drying, waterproof adhesive that will not brown leaves; available in liquid, spray and tape
- **25.** substance which is sprayed on the stems and leaves of plants to reduce the rate of transpiration, or water loss
- **26.** used to cut through very thick or tough floral material with one cut

- quick drying, waterproof adhesive that will not brown leaves; available in liquid, spray and tape forms
- **3.** long, slender bladed scissors used to cut ribbon, wire, fabric and fine netting
- 4. waterproof, all-purpose tape
- 7. a small floral adornment worn by women; No. 3 ribbon and 24 to 28 gauge wire is most commonly used in corsage work

- **9.** floral adornment worn by men and pinned onto the lapel of the jacket
- **10.** quick drying, waterproof adhesive that will not brown leaves; available in liquid, spray and tape
- 11. location within a design which attracts the most attention or the center of interest; in a corsage, the focal point is where the largest flower is placed
- 13. Triangular Shape
- **14.** the bottom part of the flower bud or blossom, consisting of the outermost sepals; usually wider than the stem and green
- **15.** used to support the flowers and help with manipulation when constructing a corsage and boutonniere
- 17. small branch bearing buds, flowers or berries
- 22. spring action handle with short blades used to cut heavy duty wire and corsage and boutonniere stems
