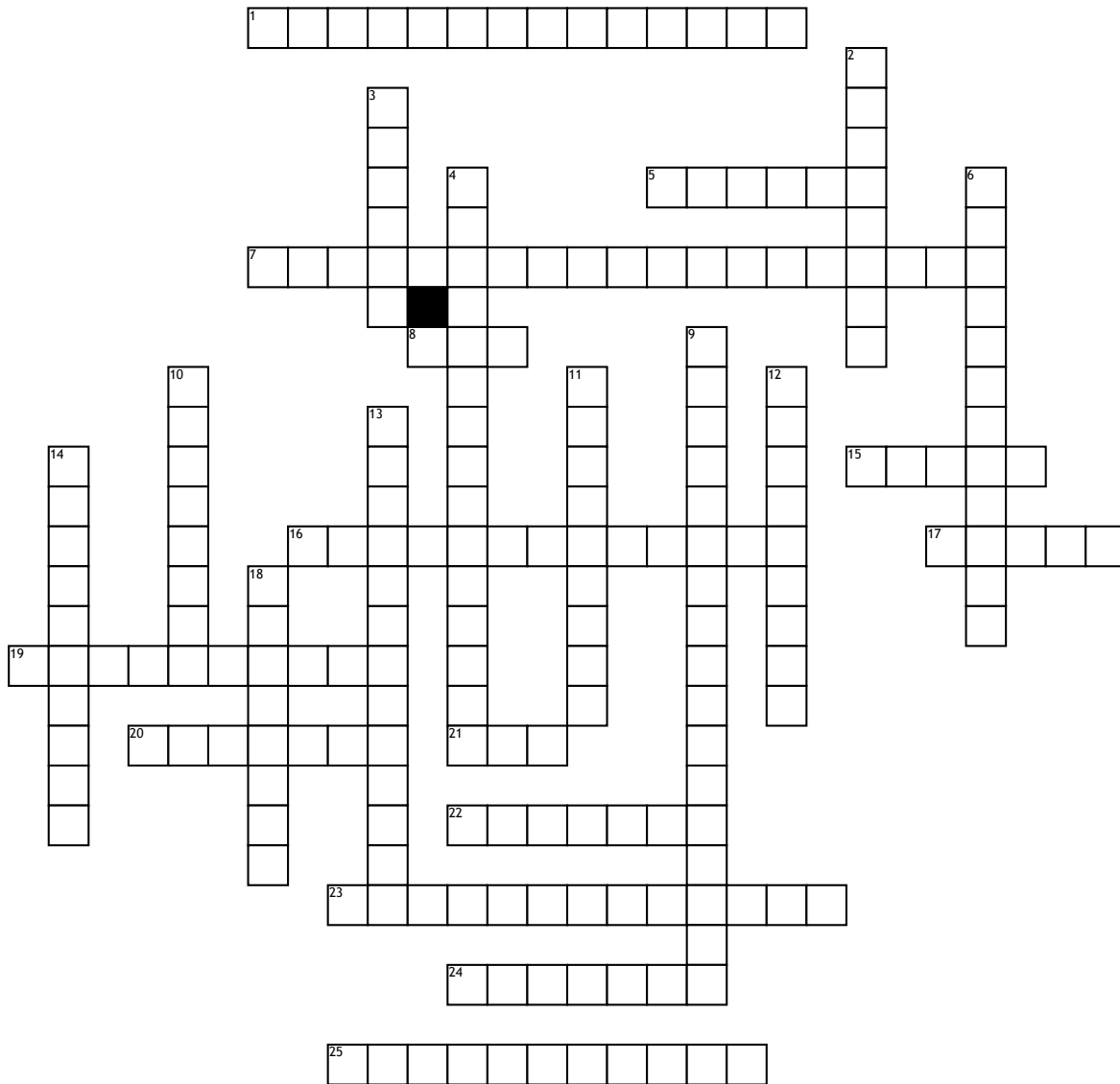

- 1. Software that has many features and is often used by professionals
- 5. Printing method that sprays a series of ink dots onto a page, allowing it to reproduce both text and images with fine detail
