| 1. a tendency or craving to eat substances other than normal food (such as clay, plaster, or ashes), occurring during childhood or pregnancy, or as a symptom of disease | A. Major Depressive Disorder     |
| 2. a rare somatoform disorder in which a person experiences very specific genuine physical symptoms for which no physiological basis can be found                        | B. Tourettes                     |
| 3. A mood disorder in which the person alternates between the hopelessness and lethargy of depression and the overexcited state of mania                                 | C. PTSD                          |
| 4. Excessive thoughts (obsessions) that lead to repetitive behaviors (compulsions)   | D. Pica                          |
| 5. Characterized by the presence of two or more distinct personality states  | E. Hoarding                      |
| 6. Characterized by disorganized and delusional thinking, disturbed perceptions, and inappropriate emotions and actions  | F. Obsessive Compulsive Disorder |
| 7. An eating disorder causing people to obsess about weight and what they eat  | G. Autism                        |
| 8. A persistent difficulty discarding or parting with possessions because of a perceived need to save them   | H. Dissociative Identity         |
| 9. Characterized by persistently depressed mood or loss of interest in activities, causing significant impairment in daily life  | I. Bipolar                       |
| 10. A nervous system disorder involving repetitive movements or unwanted sounds  | J. Schizophrenia                 |
| 11. A serious developmental disorder that impairs the ability to communicate and interact  | K. Anorexia                      |
| 12. Characterized by haunting memories, nightmares, social withdrawal, jumpy anxiety, and/or insomnia that lingers for four weeks or more after a traumatic experience   | L. Conversion                    |
