
## Discriminatory Practice in Health and Social Care

- **4.** An individual's overall subjective emotional evaluation of their own worth.
- **7.** A basis of discrimination in which someone is treated less favourably due to their customs, language, dress, beliefs and values.
- **8.** A range of negative behaviours that can intimidate or harm individuals.
- **9.** Making judgements about individuals or groups of people based on prejudices.
- **10.** A means to identify people negatively as part of a particular group. The assumption is that 'they are all the same'.
- **11.** When an individual feels a lack of control in their life, especially when they are dependent on a carer who is abusing them.
