

- **4.** an itchy rash that becomes vesicular within days and then scabs. Usually occurs with children
- 9. highly contagious, characterized by rash, red, watery eyes, high fever and can develop ear infections, pneumonia, etc.
- **10.** commonly known as a cold sore, a recurrent infection
- **12.** this virus causes cold sores
- **13.** a disease caused by bacteria that can attack any part of your body but usually attacks the lungs
- **14.** highly communicable, typically in children with spasms of severe coughing and cough induced vomiting

- **15.** burning, tingling, slight swelling before lesion appearance
- most common human virus, causes mono, transmitted orally or by droplet

<u>Down</u>

- 1. this liver disease can affect anyone, spread by oral/fecal route
- 2. most common congenital infection, symptoms vary but usually virus remains dormant, but alive until immune system is weak
- **3.** this virus that causes sexually transmitted diseases (STD) or STI
- **5.** co-infection with Hep B or super-infection. Transmission and vaccine similar to Hepatitis B.

- **6.** called non A non B, transmitted like A. Found where sewage disposal is inadequate. May be fatal especially to pregnant women.
- **7.** herpes simplex infection of the fingers
- **8.** a recurrent latent virus eruption in adults, occurs on one side of the body.
- **11.** infection of salivary glands. Fever, headache, muscle aches, swelling of the glands close to the jaw
