
## **Dissection Discovery**

- **3.** near the back of the body, "\_\_\_\_ fin"
- 6. near the head or upper half

- **13.** toward the back, synonymous with dorsal
- **14.** a limbless cold-blooded vertebrate animal with gills and fins and living wholly in water
- **16.** helps to manipulate specimens, separate & move around organs; aid in organ removal

- **17.** used for cutting through bone, muscle, cartilage, and tissue of small specimens; main tool.
- **18.** used for precision cutting and slicing; used to open the flesh/skin; may also help to remove out of body cavities sharp

- 1. near the tail or lower half
- **4.** used for grasping, pulling, compressing, or holding tissue and organs of specimen
- **5.** toward the front or stomach, synonymous with ventral
- 7. holds specimen being dissected

- **8.** used for holding specimen, tissues, limbs, and/or organs to dissecting tray
- **9.** a long-bodied, chiefly predatory fish with a cartilaginous skeleton, a prominent dorsal fin, and toothlike scales.
- **10.** comes in the earth and gummy variety
- **11.** an elongated, fast-swimming cephalopod with ten arms (technically, eight arms and two long tentacles)
