
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Dramatic Elements

- **4.** Part of a play defined by elements
- 7. A humorous character or incident in a series of literary work or drama especially a tragedy, intend to relieve the dramatic tension.
- 9. People of noble birth, great fame, a lot of whose tragic flaw causes him/her to have a downfall
- 10. Character briefly says something to himself of whispers to another character so that the other characters onstage cannot hear him/her. Only the audience can hear this.

- 11. A play which tells of the downfall of a tragic hero. It may start out well, but it will quickly go down hill.
- 12. The place and time where events of drama take place; dominated audience's idea; form backdrop

- 1. The flaw in the tragic hero of a tragedy that bring the tragic hero to ruin or sorrow.
- 2. A long speech (10 lines are more), by one character to a group. Everyone can hear this person speak.
- 3. An instruction written into the script of a play, indicating stage actions, movements of the performers, or production requirements.
- 5. A character is talking to themselves on stage allowing the audience to see in their mind. They are normally alone onstage.
- **6.** An introduction and preface, especially a poem, that is recited to introduce a play.
- **8.** A part of an act defined with the changing character or setting
