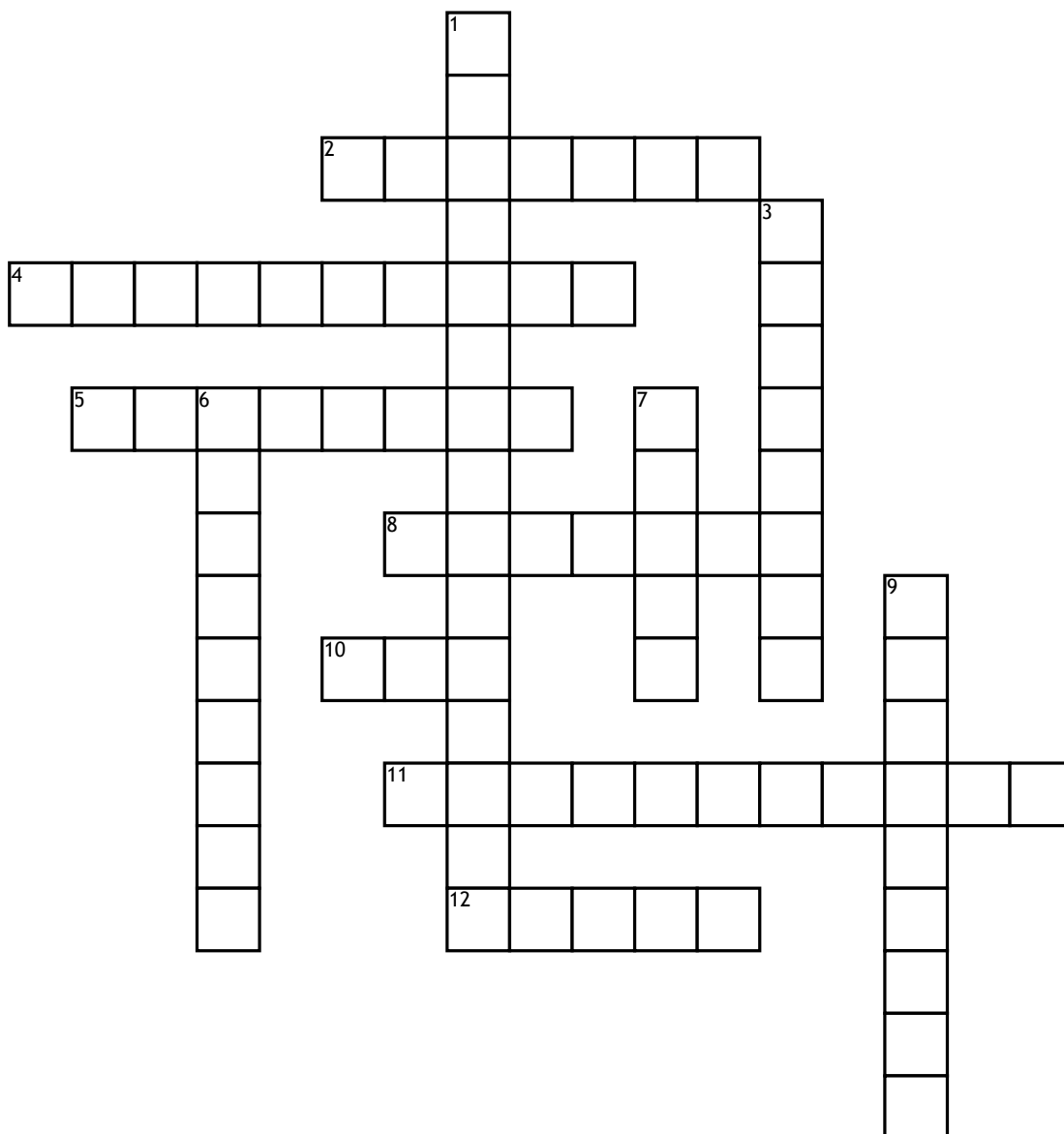

10. Part of a play defined by elements such as rising action, climax, and resolution

11. A humorous character or incident in a serious literary work or drama, especially a tragedy, intended to relieve the dramatic tension
