

- 7. Smallest part of written language.
- **8.** Children recognize the word that remains when a phoneme is removed from another word.
- 11. The ability to notice, think about, and work with individual sounds in spoken words.
- **12.** Initial consonant(s) sound of a syllable.
- **13.** Word part that contains a vowel or, in spoken language, a vowel sound.
- **14.** The understanding that there is a predictable relationship between sounds in written language.

- **15.** Part of a syllable that contains the vowel and all that follows it.
- **16.** Children recognize the same sounds in different words.

<u>Down</u>

- 1. Children make a new word by adding a phoneme to an existing word.
- Children recognize the word in a set of three or four words has the "odd" sound.
- 3. Children break a word into its separate sounds, saying each sound as they tap out or count it.
- **4.** Identifying and manipulating larger parts of spoken language, such as words, syllables and onsets and rimes- as well as phonemes.
- **5.** Children substitute one phoneme for another to make a new word.
- **6.** Children recognize individual sounds in a word.
- **9.** Children listen to a sequence of separately spoken phonemes, and then combine the phonemes to form a word.
- **10.** Smallest part of sounds in a spoken word.
