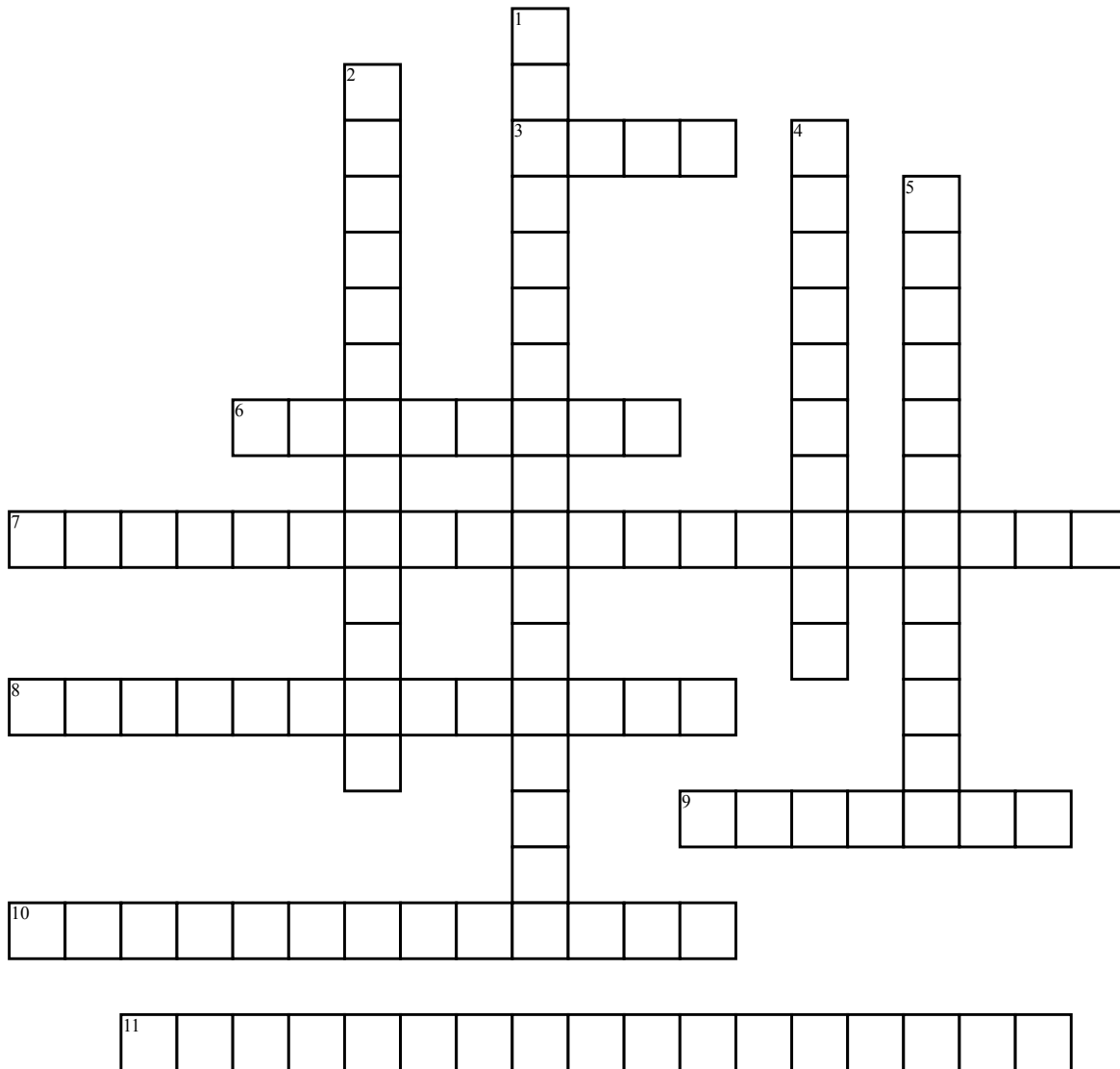


# Elements of a contract
