

- **7.** Is estimated to have disappeared from 80 percent of its original range.
- **11.** Feed primarily on soft-bodied insects, especially caterpillars.
- **13.** Lewis and Clark mentioned this bird as they moved up the Missouri River.
- **14.** Hibernates in clusters that average 170 bats per square foot.
- **15.** Was thought to be totally gone by 1940.

- **1.** An aquatic salamander which lives under rocks in quiet pools.
- **2.** Relatively transparent-appearing fish with dark speckles on its back.
- **3.** Are armored with lengthwise rows of bony plates instead of scales.
- **4.** It is shiny black with bright orange markings.
- **5.** Is sometimes called the "ghost lizard" of Ozark caves.

- **6.** Uses its long, prehensile tail to help climb cave walls in search of invertebrates.
- **8.** Has a sickle-shaped dorsal fin, has very small eyes.
- **9.** 90 percent of diet consists of prairie dogs.
- **10.** During the first year, they consume small crustaceans and midge larvae and pupae.
- **12.** White with rust-colored patches on top and back of head.
