
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Endocrine Glands

- regulate development, growth, and function of the ovaries and testes
- 3. promotes development of glandular tissue during pregnancy and produces milk after birth of an infant
- 4. stimulates the kidney to reabsorb water
- 7. produces and secretes the following hormones:

- approximately the size of a pea and located at the case of the brain.
- 17. stimulates the adrenal cortex
- 18. lusters of endocrine tissue found throughout the pancreas, made up of different cell types that secrete various hormones, including insulin and glucagon
