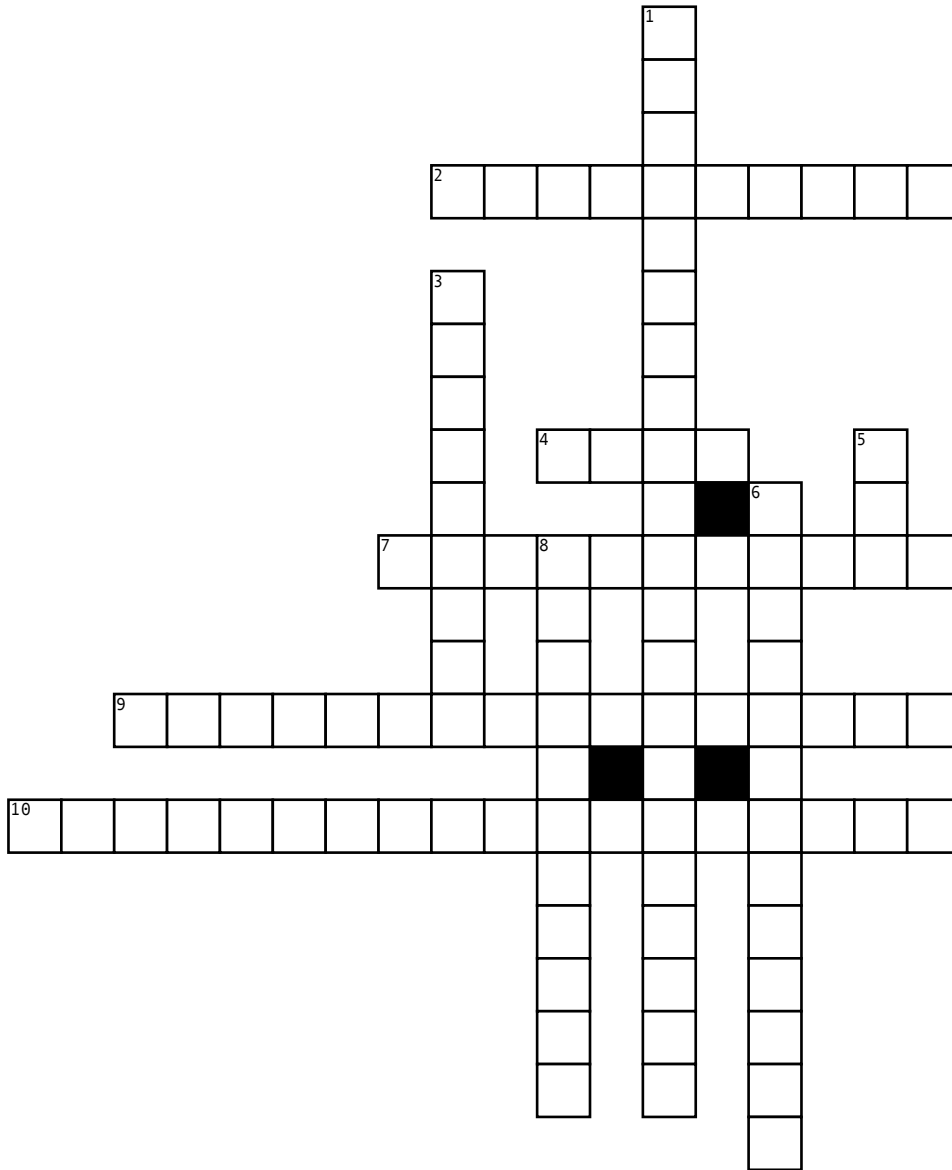


# Energy Resources Vocabulary

- 2. Flammable gas, consisting largely of methane and other hydrocarbons, occurring naturally underground (often in association with petroleum) and used as fuel.
- 4. A combustible black or dark brown rock consisting mainly of carbonized plant matter, found mainly in underground deposits and widely used as fuel.
- 7. A natural fuel such as coal or gas, formed in the geological past from the remains of living organisms.
- 9. Heat energy generated and stored in the Earth.

- 10. A resource which can be used repeatedly and replaced naturally.

- 1. A resource of economic value that cannot be readily replaced by natural means on a level equal to its consumption.
- 3. Power obtained by harnessing the energy of the wind.
- 5. A viscous liquid derived from petroleum, especially for use as a fuel or lubricant.
- 6. The energy released during nuclear fission or fusion, especially when used to generate electricity.
