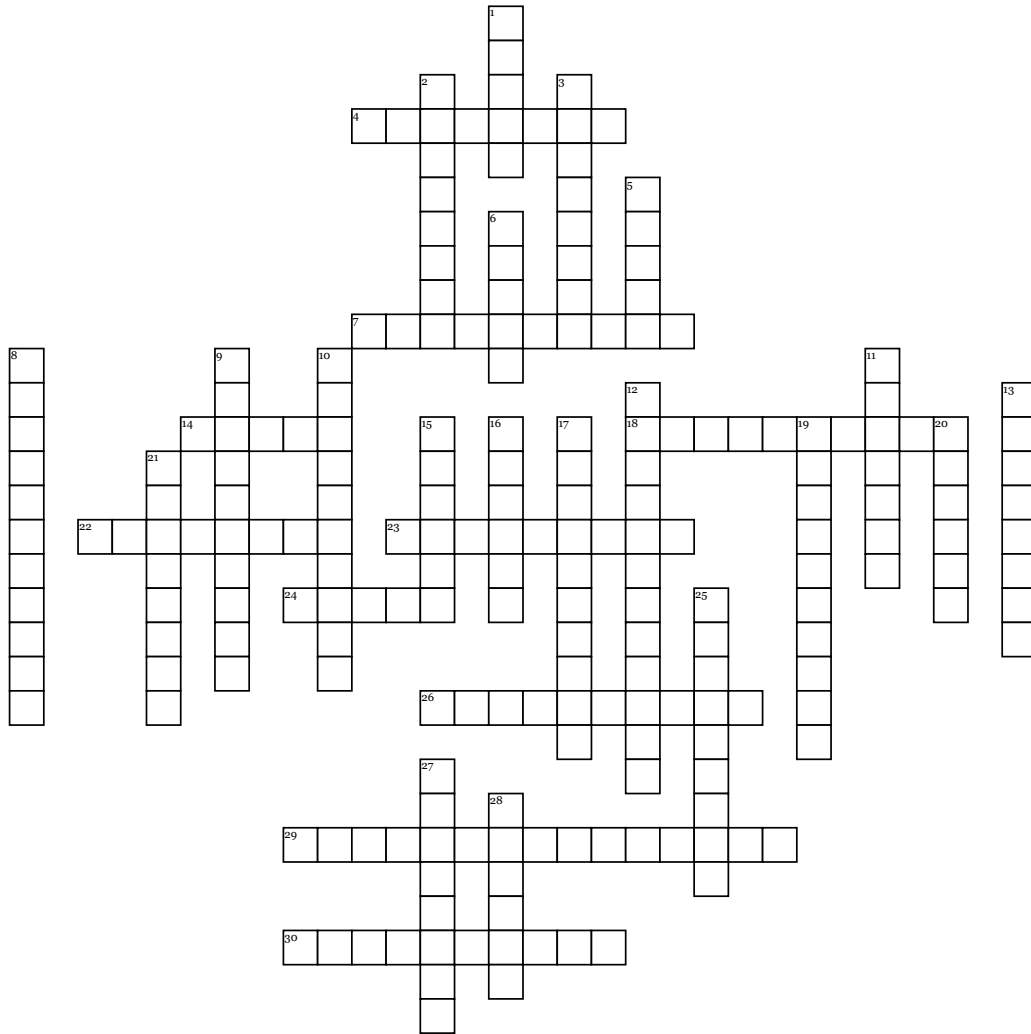


Europe Crossword Puzzle
