

3. Abnormal findings on the retina of the eye. They appear as fluffy white patches on the retina.

5. Flat, benign pigmented area that appears in the back of the eye and is basically an eye freckle.

8. A shrunken, non-functional eye. It may result from severe eye disease, inflammation or injury, or it may represent a complication of eye surgery.

11. A condition where the eye's optic nerve is damaged due to increased pressure in eye.

12. A pink coloured growth that starts on the clear tissue of the eye called conjunctiva.

13. Perception of a single object as two images adjacent or overlapping.

14. A condition where the cornea bulges outwards into a cone shape.

15. A condition in which the eyes do not properly align with each other when looking at an object.

17. Small yellow or white spots on the retina.

19. Any pathological condition of the macula.

20. Damage to the optic nerve resulting in a degeneration or destruction of the optic nerve.

21. Thin, transparent layers of fibrous tissues that form a film on the inner surface of the retina.

23. An inflammation of the eyelids.

1. A symptom in which bright lights hurts or irritates the eyes.

2. A small painful lump in the edge of the eyelid.

4. A common vision condition that causes blurred vision.

6. A small break in the macula, located in the center of the the retina.

7. Optic disc swelling that is caused by increased intracranial pressure.

9. Inflammation of the transparent covering of the eye because of bacterial infection or allergic reaction.

10. Visual perceptions of dark small shadowy shapes that obstruct the vision.

16. A vision impairment resulting from deterioration of the central part of retina, often due to old age.

18. An instrument consisting of a high-intensity light source that can be focused to shine a thin sheet of light into the eye.

22. Abnormalities of the blood vessels that supply the retina of the eye, a sign of diabetic retinopathy.
