


# Family Law Terminology



## Across

2. the failure to defend an action  
 8. computer program used to calculate support  
 11. Latin word meaning "pending the suit". During the actual progress of the suit. Temporary orders pending trial/judgment. (2 wds)  
 12. A stopping; a halting of all or part of the proceedings  
 13. Latin word that means "by or for one party". Refers to situations in which only one party makes a request. (2 wds)  
 14. to make declaration under pain and penalty of perjury  
 15. Status of the married parties is changed from married to single (divorced). When that is the only subject determined in a judgment (2 wds)  
 16. to stay or delay for a period of time  
 18. to change or revise

19. Statement by way of advice or caution by the court

22. the act of terminating a marriage; divorce  
 23. a written record of oral testimony, in the form of questions and answers  
 24. The act of joining two or more independent suits  
 25. Formal exceptions taken to the personal qualification of a judge about to preside over a matter  
 26. creating a debt in support

1. Commands the submission of some or document in their possession or control (3 wds)  
 3. an order issued from a court requiring the performance of a certain act  
 4. Latin word meaning "in one's own person". Not by an attorney (2 wds)

5. "Now for then". Applied to acts that are allowed to be done after the time when they should have been done. A retroactive correction. (Latin - 3 wds)  
 6. to divide into separate parts  
 7. to leave a document, record or other evidentiary item with the Court for its reference. The item is returned without filing at the end of the proceedings  
 9. Spousal Support  
 10. Annul; to nullify, cancel abolish; to make void by competent authority  
 17. Appointed by the Court to act as a temporary judge in certain case types  
 20. Bringing together. The addition of a party to a case  
 21. the disclosure by a party of facts, titles, documents or other things which are in his/her exclusive knowledge or possession
