

## Feeding, Management, and Housing of Sheep



## **Across**

- 6. Maintain sheep flock to produce meat and wool
- 8. Fermented, high-moisture stored fodder which can be fed to cattle, sheep, and other ruminants
- 12. Lambs born before December 25th
- 13. Marking of an animal as a sign of ownership or identity
- 14. Practice of feeding a ration for 10 days to 2 weeks before breeding and 2 weeks after breeding that causes ewe to gain rapidly

- 15. Tool used to remove the wool from sheep
- 16. A system that produces three lamb crops in 2 years and uses ewes that will breed out of season

## <u>Down</u>

- 1. Lambs born in March, April, and May
- 2. Portable hurdle that can be lengthened or shortened as needed
- 3. Condition in which the uterus protrudes from the vulva
- 4. Cutting off part of tail

- 5. First milk produced by ewe
- 7. Lambs born in January and February
- 9. Produce breeding stock for commercial flocks and other purebred flocks
- 10. Tool used to orally administer pills to livestock
- 11. Shearing around the udder, between the legs, and around the dock
