

**13.** Founding Father and principal author of Declaration of Independence; early and effective leader in the American Revolution Sons of Liberty - workers and tradesmen who originally banded together to undermine the Stamp Act; they were the driving force behind the Boston Tea Party. Their motto became, "No taxation without representation."

In 1783, he was one of the negotiators of the Treaty of Paris that ended the American Revolution.
