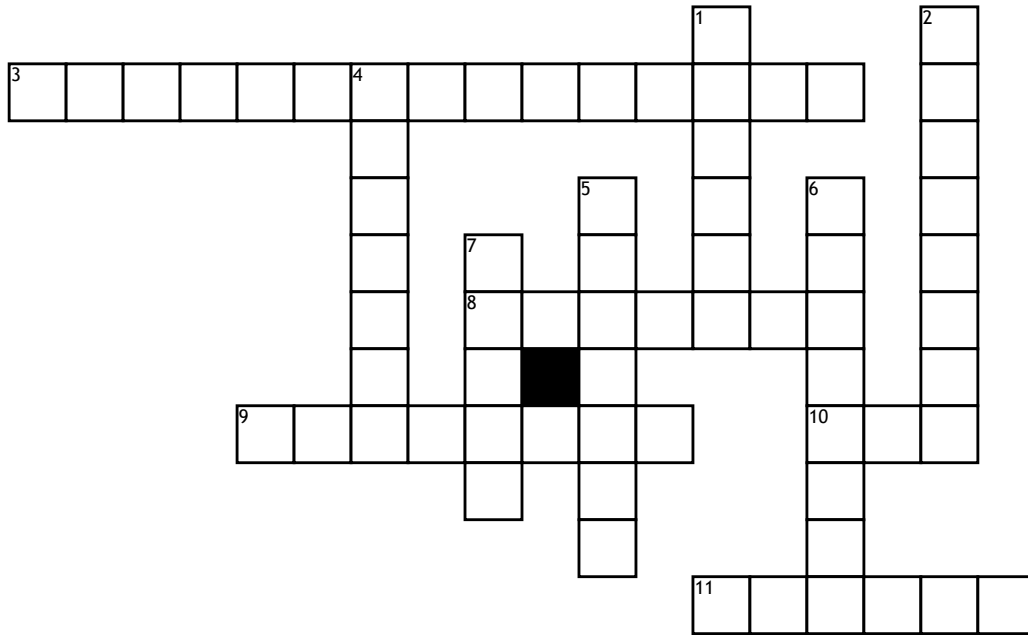


Figurative Language
