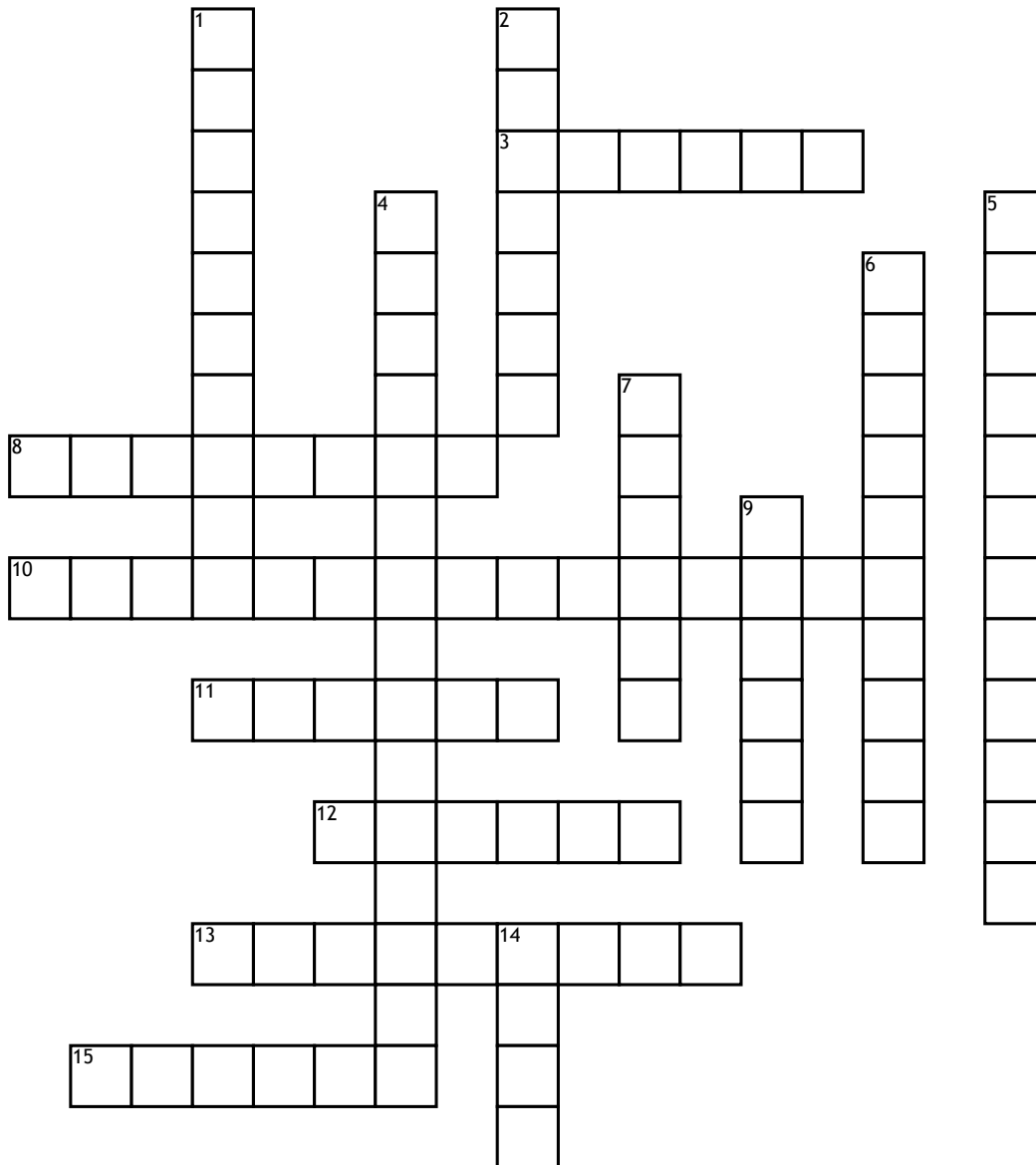


Fireplace Vocabulary



Across

- 3. the floor of a fireplace, usually of stone, brick, etc., often extending a short distance into a room.
- 8. a refractory clay used for making crucibles, firebricks, etc.
- 10. open on two sides placed opposite the room.
- 11. a bar of refractory clay, triangular in section, for supporting one side of an object being fired.
- 12. a movable plate for regulating the draft in a stove, furnace, etc.

13. open on three sides.

- 15. a receptacle in the bottom of a fireplace, under a barbecue, or the like, for the accumulation of ashes.

Down

- 1. a ledge at the bottom of a smoke chamber, so made as to deflect or break downdrafts from the chimney.
- 2. an opening in the bottom of a fireplace or furnace leading to an ash pit below
- 4. open on two sides placed adjacent to the room.

- 5. an enlarged area between the throat of a fireplace and the chimney flue.
- 6. a type of fireplace design that is open to one room.
- 7. the narrow opening between a fireplace and its flue or smoke chamber, often closed by a damper.
- 9. a horizontal architectural member supporting the weight above an opening, as a window or a door.
- 14. a passage or duct for smoke in a chimney.
