

- **12.** Dubbed the 'Nutcracker' in S.America. Has molar-like teeth. Listed as an omnivore.
- **13.** Absorbs nutrients through it's skin, produces litres of slime in minutes.

14. Common tinned food or bait for sea fishing. Has dark wavy stripes which are a 'schooling mark' to swim at the same speed as it's school.

- 1. No sclaes for first month of life. Found in UK. Have vomerine teeth. Not to be confused with their Rainbow friends.
- **2.** Largest of the Anarhichadidae family, has a natural antifreeze in their blood and protruding fang-like canine teeth.

- **3.** Also known as the Giant Devil Catfish
- **4.** Longest bony fish in the ocean. They can reach a length of over 50 feet. Swims vertically.
- **5.** Thought to be extinct until found in S. Africa in 1938.
- 7. Named after it's captor
- **8.** The largest of the tunas and can live up to 40 years.
- **10.** Common name: Pirarucu in Brazil, paiche in Peru.
