| 5. Verse written to create a response of thought and feeling from the reader. It often uses rhythm and rhyme to help convey the message.                                    | E. Traditional Fiction |
| 6. A story using made-up characters that could happen in real life.   | F. Science Fiction     |
| 7. Texts that provide facts about a variety of topics (sports, weather, geography, etc.).   | G. Historical Fiction  |
| 8. Stories that are meant to be performed, such as radio plays, comedies, and historical dramas.  | H. Drama               |
