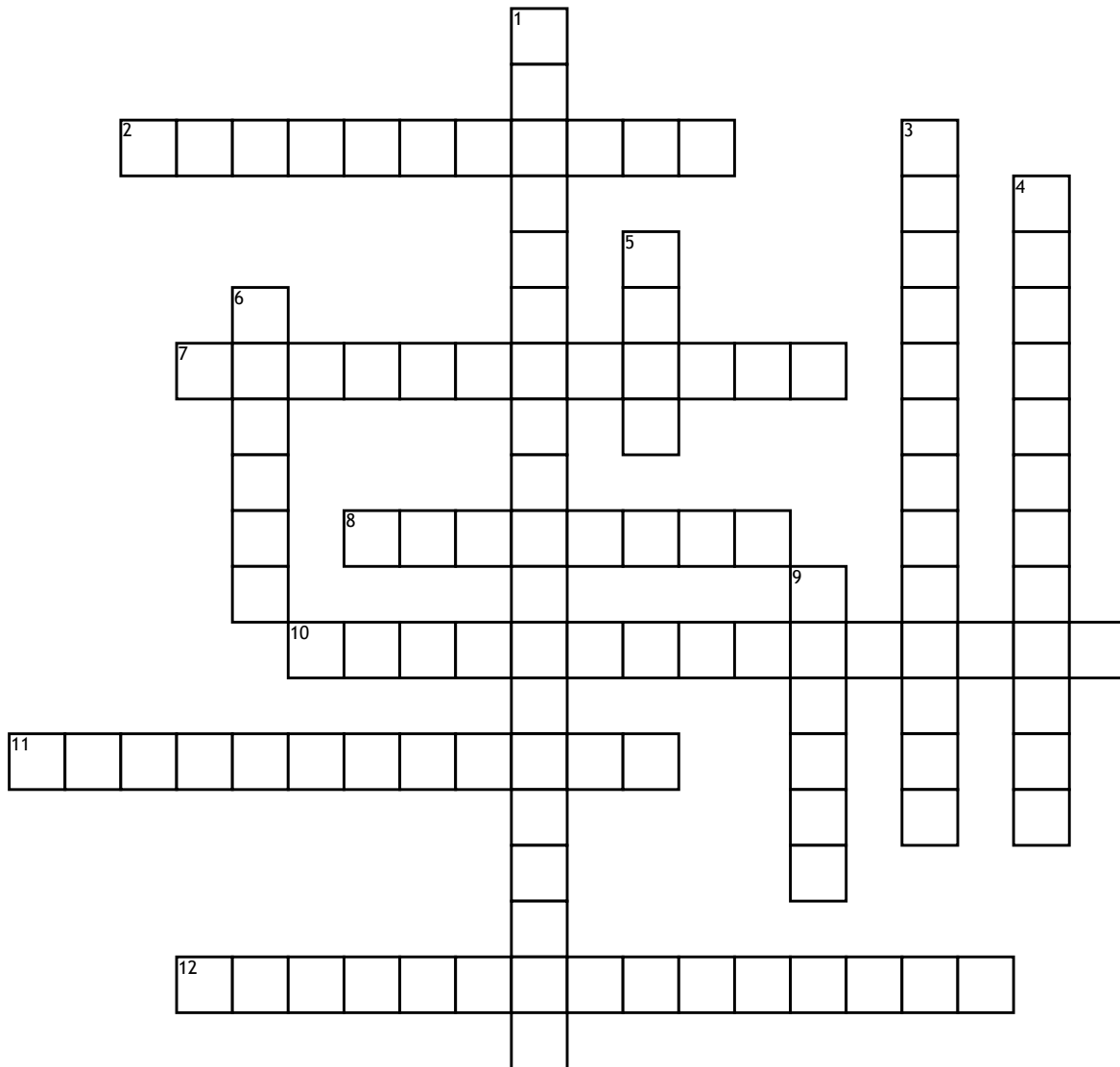

2. Herniation of abdominal contents through the umbilical ring, usually with an intact peritoneal sac.

7. Congenital megacolon

8. Malrotation of the intestine that disrupts blood flow to the intestine

10. Another name for acute diarrhea

11. Alteration in frequency, consistency or ease of passage of stool

12. Telescoping of one portion of intestine into another

1. Complication from failure of the omphalomesenteric duct to fuse during embryonic development

3. Herniation lateral to the umbilical ring and peritoneal sac

4. Characterized by pain in RLQ and high WBC count

5. Effortless passage of gastric contents into mouth or esophagus

6. Surgery that involves creating a one-way valve by wrapping gastric fundus 360 degrees around the lower end of the esophagus

9. Protrusion of part of an organ through cavity wall
