


Georgia as a Colony

 6. An Englishman sent to the New World to establish a new colony
 7. The economic process of a country and its colonies exporting more goods than it imports
 8. A man whom ruled over the colony according to instructions from the king

 14. Places set up by the mother country to covert Natives to the Christian religion
 15. A colony ruled by representatives from the mother country (England)
